ORDER DECLARING RESULTS OF AN ELECTION HELD IN THE VILLAGE OF RIO VISTA,

JOHNSON COUNTY, TEXAS, APRIL 6, A. D. 1954.

Whereas, an election was duly held in the Village of Rio Vista, Johnson County, Texas, on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of April, A. D. 1954, to determine whether the hereinafter described territory should be incorporated for municipal purposes, under the Commission Form of Government, to be known as the Village of Rio Vista, Texas and returns of said election duly made and it appearing from said returns that a majority of the votes were cast at said election in favor of incorporation under the Commission Form of Government, there being seventy-one (71) votes for incorporation and eleven (11) votes for no incorporation.

It is, therefore, adjudged and decreed that said election resulted in favor of such incorporation; and I, H. G. Littlefair, County Judge of Johnson County, Texas, do hereby declare the inhabitants of said territory hereinafter described as duly incorporated for municipal purposes, under the Commission Form of Government, to be known as the Village of Rio Vista, Johnson County, Texas.
