Corridor walls and ceiling on floors 1, 2, 3, 4, including all interior ironwork and woodwork, County Courtroom, ceiling, walls and woodwork, County Sheriff's Offices, ceiling, walls and woodwork, County Agents' offices, ceiling, walls, floors and woodwork, All exterior woodwork around windows, doors and metal window guards.

Work to be done in first class manner; protecting all floors and furniture. Contractor to be responsible for all work. All ceilings and walls to be prepared by sanding or scraping all loose paint and patching all holes, cracks, etc., in all areas to be painted. Replacing all broken mold around top of marble and nailing existing mold where needed.

Two coats of paint on all ceiling and walls in all areas to be painted, including two coats on floors in County Agents' Offices.

Windows, doors and woodwork on each corridor on floors 1, 2, 3, 4, Sheriff's Offices, County Courtroom and County Agents' Office to be sanded with fine sand paper and scratches, marks and blemishes stained to match existing wood and to receive two coats varnish on woodwork in all areas.
