BE IT REMEMBERED AT A CALLED MEETING of the Commissioners' Court in and for Johnson County, Texas, on the above mentioned date at the Courthouse in Cleburne, Texas, with the following members present: Thomas E. Ball, County Judge, C. W. Atwood, Commissioner of Precinct No. 1, W. R. Bryant, Commissioner of Precinct No. 2, W. I. Boteler, Commissioner of Precinct No. 3, M. W. Roland, Commissioner of Precinct No. 4, Louis B. Lee, County Clerk, John Butner, E. H. Vaughn, Texas Department Public Welfare, Austin, and Forrest Moore, U. S. Department Agriculture, Dallas, Food program.

A motion made by Commissioner Atwood and seconded by Commissioner Bryant with motion passed unanimously the Commissioners' Court of Johnson County hereby authorizes the Commissioner shown below to use County employees and equipment to construct and/or maintain a private road within his precinct as shown below, as authorized by Article 6812b, Texas Civil Statutes, to-wit:
