





Any tracks shall be constructed under the terms of Lessor's standard Industrial Track Agreement. Lessee agrees not to make any further alterations, additions, or improvements to the premises without the prior written consent of Lessor.
- 4. Utilities: To contract for and supply at its own cost and expense all utilities and their installation required by the Lessee in the conduct of its business; subject to Lessee having first secured the approval of Lessor in writing; and having complied with all federal, state, county and municipal laws, orders, regulations, and ordinances connected with the maintenance and use of said utilities; and to protect, indemnify and hold harmless Lessor from any fines or penalties arising from any violation by Lessee of any said laws, orders, regulations or ordinances.
- 5. Appearance: To care for the grounds of the leased premises, including mowing of grass, care of shrubs, and general landscaping, and to keep the parking area, driveways, alleys, and the whole of the premises in a clean, sanitary and satisfactory condition to Lessor.
- 6. Hazardous Commodity Compliance: Lessee agrees not to allow, keep, use, store, or place upon the leased premises, or permit to be kept, used, stored, or placed thereon any commodities of any kind having an explosive, dangerous, flammable nature, and violation of this covenant shall automatically and without any further action on the part of Lessor be deemed a default and breach of this lease by Lessee, and shall entitle Lessor to immediate possession of the premises, and a forfeiture by Lessee of any unearned rental.
- 7. Clearances: Not to erect or maintain, or suffer to be erected or maintained on the leased premises, any obstruction over any railroad track or tracks on or adjacent to the said premises less than twenty-three (23') feet above the top of the rail, or alongside any such track or tracks less than ten (10') feet from the center thereof, are twenty-fiver(25'k) from the center thereof, and to maintain greater clearance than that herein provided for if Lessor shall so designate in writing, or if greater clearances be required by statute or order of any competent public authority, and to protect, indemnify and hold harmless Lessor from any fines or penalties arising from a violation by Lessee of any such statute or order. Regardless of the provisions of any other section contained in this agreement, all loss, injury or damage of any and every kind or nature whatsoever to any person or persons whomsoever, arising directly or indirectly out of a breach of this section by Lessee shall be the sole responsibility of Lessee, regardless of any negligence on the part of Lessor, or its agents and employees, and Lessee shall indemnify and hold Lessor harmless from all claims, costs, suits, judgements, and attorneys' fees.
- 8. Liability: (a) Except as otherwise provided in sub-section (c) of this section, Lessee hereby assumes all liability and all risks of loss, injury or damage of any kind or nature whatsoever to any buildings, other structures or appurtenances thereto, belonging to Lessee, or to others, or to any goods, merchandise, chattels or to the contents of such buildings or structures, or any other property that may be now or hereafter placed upon said leased premises, or on land adjoining or adjacent thereto, and which are at the time used in connection with any buildings or structures on said premises, unless such loss, injury or damage be caused solely and directly by the negligence of Lessor, its agents, or employees; provided, however, that if any such loss, injury or damage aforesaid shall arise from fire, theft, or other casualty, which can be insured against, then Lessee assumes the risks thereof, and shall protect, and indemnify Lessor as herein provided, regardless of whether the same be caused or contributed to by the negligence of Lessor, its agents, employees or otherwise.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided in sub-section (c) of this section, Lessee hereby assumes all liability and all the risks of injury to or death of himself and of any persons in his or its employ, and of all persons whomsoever who may be upon or about said leased premises, or on land adjoining or adjacent thereto, unless such injury or death be caused solely and directly by the negligence of Lessor, its agents, or employees.
- (c) Lessee assumes the risks of injury to or death of himself, and all persons whomsoever, and of loss or damage to property whosesoever growing out of the presence, loading or unloading of tank cars upon or adjacent to the leased premises, or the handling or storage upon or about said premises of any goods of an explosive, dangerous or flammable nature in violation of Paragraph 6 above, regardless of whether same be caused or contributed to by the negligence of Lessor, its agents, or employees.
- (d) The risks of injury to or death of persons and loss or damage to property herein assumed by Lessee, as herein defined, shall include, but shall not be limited to, loss or damage to property of either of the parties hereto, and injury to or death of, or the loss or damage to property of the officers, agents, employees, contractors, licensees, or invitees of either of the parties hereto, and whether or not such injury to or death of persons shall arise under any Workmen's Compensation Act or Federal Employers' Liability Act.
- (e) Lessee, for himself, or itself, and for his, or its heirs, successors, assigns, officers, agents, contractors, and employees, does hereby agree to protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Lessor from, and to reimburse Lessor for, any and all liability and damages arising out of the risks herein assumed by Lessee, including claims, suits, judgements, costs, attorneys' fees, and all other expenses incurred by Lessor in defense of any claims, causes of action, or judgements arising from any liability assumed by Lessee herein.
- 9. Waiver: To waive all right to question the validity of this lease or any of the terms or provisions hereof, or the right or power of Lessor to execute and enforce the same, and to waive all right to claim damages in the event Lessee shall be ejected from or required to surrender possession of the leased premises by reason of the failure of title of Lessor, or for other cause.

ARTICLE III

It is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

- 1. Landlord's Lien: Lessor shall have, and is hereby given a lien upon all buildings and structures erected by Lessee on the premises, and upon all of Lessee's property therein, or on the premises, to secure the payment of rental or other amounts for which Lessee may be obligated to Lessor hereunder. Lessee may remove from the premises any such buildings or structures erected on the premises by Lessee at any time before the expiration or any termination of this lease, provided that Lessee be not at the time in default in the payment of rent, or in the performance of any obligation under this agreement.
- 2. Refunds: If and when this lease shall be terminated pursuant to Section 1 of Article I, hereof, or by the happening of any of the events specified in Section 8(a) of this Article III, and Lessee has complied with the conditions of Section 6 of this Article III, Lessor shall refund to Lessee any unearned rental paid in advance; but if this lease shall be terminated by Lessor, pursuant to Section 3 or 5 of this Article III, or by reason of default or breach hereof, no unearned rent shall be refunded, and such unearned rental shall be deemed liquidated damages; provided, however, that no unearned rental shall be refunded in any case if the unearned rental shall not exceed Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars. Lessor expressly reserves the right to increase the rental rate at any time during the lease year upon giving Lessee thirty (30) days' notice of its intention to increase said rent. In such event, Lessor agrees to prorate any advanced rentals paid by Lessee for the then current year to the date of said increase.
- 3. Casualty: In case any buildings, structures or works upon the leased premises shall at any time during the term hereof be destroyed in whole or in part by tire, tornado, flood, or other acts of God, Lessee shall give Lessor immediate written notice of such occurrence, and Lessee shall have ninety (90) days thereafter in which to rebuild same, in accordance with plans approved by Lessor's Chief Engineer. In the event the property so destroyed shall not be rebuilt in a manner satisfactory to Lessor's Chief Engineer, or other authorized officer within the said time, this lease may be terminated at the option of Lessor.
- 4. Right of Entry: Lessor through its duly authorized representative shall at all reasonable times, have right of entry and free access to said leased premises, and every part thereof, for the purpose of inspecting the same to determine its condition, and to determine whether or not Lessee is using and occupying the same for the purpose, and in the manner herein set forth; or to construct, extend or repair any side, switch or main line track, or to enter upon and to make use of said premises when necessary, in order to clear any derailment, or to restore service over any side, switch or main line track.
- 5. Default: In case Lessee shall make default in the payment of any rental as and when due by the terms of this lease, or shall default in any of the other covenants, agreements, or undertakings herein contained to be by Lessee kept and performed, or shall violate any of the provisions or conditions hereof, Lessor may declare this lease at an end, and enter into, upon and possess said leased premises as its former estate, together with the buildings and structures thereon and appurtenances thereto, with or without process of law, and may remove therefrom Lessee and all persons occupying the same or any part thereof, using such force as may be necessary for that purpose. Failure by Lessor to enforce one or more of the remedies herein provided upon an event of default shall not be constitute a waiver of such default. Lessee agrees to pay all attorneys' fees resulting from any suits or actions growing out of Lessee's failure to pay the rental in the amount and manner herein specified. No action or proceeding by Lessor, under this paragraph shall in any manner release or discharge the covenants, agreements, and undertakings of Lessee of any of the obligations, risks, or duties assumed herein by Lessee, which may have accrued as of the date of any default.
- 6. Termination: Upon the expiration or any termination of this lease, including termination by reason of default, Lessee shall, at the option of Lessor, remove all structures from the leased premises within twenty (20) days following such expiration or termination, regardless of whether or not such structures were placed thereon by Lessee or others, and surrender the leased premises to the possession of Lessor in a condition satisfactory to Lessor, reasonable wear and tear and acts of God for the purposes herein authorized excepted. If Lessor elects not to have said buildings or structures removed, same shall thereafter be deemed to be a part of the realty and shall become the property of Lessor. In the event Lessor elects to have Lessee remove same, and Lessee fails to do so, same shall either become part of the realty, and the property of Lessor, or, Lessor may remove such buildings and structures, and Lessee hereby agrees to reimburse Lessor for the expense thereof.
- 7. Holding Over: Should Lessee hold over the premises or any part thereof, after the expiration of the term of this lease, unless otherwise agreed in writing, such holding over shall constitute and be construed as tenancy from month to month, at a rental equal to the rental payable for the last month of the term of this lease, or 1/12th of the annual rental if rental is paid annually, plus fifty (50%) percent of such amount. The inclusion of the preceding sentence shall not be construed as Lessor's permission for Lessee to hold over, nor shall acceptance of rental waive any accrued rights of Lessor or accrued liabilities of Lessee, or any default, termination or cancellation of this lease.

8. Miscellaneous:

- (a) This lease is personal to the Lessee and shall not inure to the benefit of any receiver, trustee, or other officer, or of any assignee for the benefit of creditors, as an asset of Lessee, but shall cease and terminate upon the appointment of any such receiver, trustee, or other officer, or the making of any such assignment.
- (b) This lease and all of the provisions herein contained shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, and Lessee agrees to supply notice in writing to Lessor of any name changes. Lessee agrees not to sublet said leased premises, or any part thereof, or assign this lease, or any interest therein without the consent of Lessor expressed in writing, and any and every

- (e) No oral promises, oral agreements, or oral warranties shall be deemed a part of this Lease, nor shall any alteration, amendment, supplement or waiver of any of the provisions of this lease be binding upon either party hereto, unless the same be supplemented, altered, changed or amended by an instrument in writing, signed by Lessor and Lessee.



During the week of February 21-24, 1978, Judges Lorene Patterson and Charlene Wallace successfully completed a twenty hour course in the responsibilities of the office of Justice of the Peace. Article 5972 of the Texas Revised Civil Statutes requires each newly elected/appointed Justice of the Peace to complete a forty hour course in the responsibilities of the J.P. office and additionally to complete a twenty hour course each year thereafter. This article encompasses all justices who took office since August 30, 1963 and are not licensed attorneys. The funding of this program, which provides free room and board for the judges at the seminar, is made possible through a grant from the Governor's Office, Criminal Justice Division.

We at the Training Center realize how important it is to you and the people you serve to insure that your county Justices of the Peace are properly trained and equipped to carry out the duties and obligations of the office. As ninety to ninety-five percent of our citizenry have their one and only contact with a lower court judge, it is imperative that this contact be as judicious as possible.



The Texas Department of Health has the responsibelity of providing public health services to protect and promote the health of millions of Texans.

To make these services more available throughout the State the Texas Department of Health is now divided into ten public health regions. Each region is fully staffed with public health professionals who are available to local communities on a year-round basis. By providing public health services on a regional basis there is much greater availability to, and closer contact with all counties in the State.

Johnson County is located in the southern portion of Public Health Region 5. This region has a total population of 2,979,700. Eight counties in the Region have local health departments with a total population of 2,614,600. The seventeen remaining counties with a population of 365,100 do not have city or county health departments. Johnson County, with an estimated population, July 1975, of 56,500 is one of these seventeen counties.

In order for Public Health Region 5 to provide a comprehensive public health program in Johnson County, it will be necessary to establish a field office in Cleburne. The field office will be staffed with one or two public health nurses and a licensed vocational nurse who will provide valuable public health nursing services to the community and serve as an important contact point for health problems requiring the services of other public health disciplines. Experience has shown that this system is more effective when locally situated than by trying to provide all services from the regional headquarters in Arlington.

For your benefit, an outline is attached showing public health services available through Public Health Region 5.

Currently the services being provided in Johnson County include immunization clinics held on a monthly basis in Cleburne and held every other month in Burleson. The following are statistics on the immunization program from January, 1977 - April, 1978.

The Texas Department of Health has a Chronic Disease Screening Program that is available to all adults in Public Health Region 5. The goal of the program is to identify persons at high risk of having a chronic debilitating disease such as hypertension or diabetes.

The program consists of screening according to guidelines based on history, age, and symptoms and if findings are above normal limits referral of the person to the private physician. Both hypertension and diabetes screening has been done in the immunization clinics.

Hypertension screening and diabetes screening have been done at the Cleburne Senior Citizens Center and the Joshua Senior Citizens Center.

The Chronic Disease Screening program offers many benefits to all adults. Due to the nature of the screening process, follow-up, and referral, this program can only be offered in counties in which there is a permanent clinic site.

When screening results indicate a problem, the individual is referred back to the private physician. There is no charge for the screening tests, but the private physician's charges are the responsibility of the individual.

The State Department of Health also has a crippled children's program which provides financial assistance to families with children with certain congenital joint, bone, or muscle defect or deformity, heart defects, and cystic fibrosis. Currently there are 40 children in Johnson County receiving assistance through this program. Thirty-five of these families are currently being visited in the home by the public health nurses because of their health problems and those of other family members.

Public Health Region 5 currently holds a monthly Tuberculosis Nursing Clinic and a quarterly Tuberculosis Medical Clinic in Cleburne in the Henderson Street Baptist Church. From March, 1977 through March, 1978, Public Health Region 5 staff have provided tuberculosis services for 221 patients from Johnson County in these clinics.

Environmental Health

To properly protect the health and safety of the citizens of Johnson County a full time sanitarian should be employed. The Environmental Health program of Region 5 does not have sufficient personnel to assign permanently to serve Johnson County to the extent needed.

This locally employed sanitarian could inspect retail food establishments; inspect the installation of septic tank systems; investigate complaints relating to the environment; assist individuals in the proper operation of private water systems; assist local industry, through consultation, on environmental problems; take water samples for bacteriological analysis for individuals and companies; and remain current on all public health laws and ordinances to properly inform the public about these laws and regulations.

With the availability of an adequate water supply through the rural water systems, Johnson County is growing at a rapid pace. There are numerous homes being built in areas not served by sanitary sewers, with the consequence that septic tank systems must be utilized. Without control through permitting and inspection of septic tank installations, Johnson County will experience continuing problems with malfunctioning sewer systems. A locally employed sanitarian can do this necessary permitting and inspection.

Region 5 is currently expending approximately \$20,000 per year providing environmental health services.
Region 5 will continue to provide technical assistance and consultation as needed but cannot provide a full time employee.

To support the public health activities in Johnson County, the complete public health services of Public Health Region 5 are available. These include Public Health Nursing, Immunizations, Tuberculosis Control, Venereal Disease Control, Public Health Dentistry, Emergency Medical Services, Environmental Engineering, General Sanitation, Crippled Children's Services and others. The total effort of these programs can better serve Johnson County if provided through a permanent office and clinic facility in Johnson County.

Annual Operating Cost Sanitarian I and Clerk-Typist II \$23,516.00

In addition to personnel, office and clinic space of approximately 1,500 square feet will be needed. Telephone and maintenance service for this space will need to be provided.

I have examined the abstract of title to a tract of land out of the C. Chaney Survey located in the City of Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas, fronting 150 feet east on North Anglin Street, as set forth in an abstract of title consisting of 70 pages and last certified to April 6, 1978, by Stewart Title of Johnson County, Inc.

I find title to this property to be in T. D. Nutt or Thelma Dewitt Nutt and Irene Nutt, subject to the following conditions:

1.

There are irregularities in the early chain of title which in our opinion may be safely waived because of the lapse of time.

2.

T. D. Nutt and wife, Irene Nutt, are both deceased. I am informed that both died intestate; therefore the property passed to their heirs in accordance with the laws of descent and distribution of the State of Texas, and the deed to the County should be executed by said heirs, joined by their respective husbands or wives.

3.

On Page 61 of the abstract there appears an easement executed by T. D. Nutt and wife, Irene Nutt, to the Texas Power & Light Company, dated December 19, 1947, and recorded in Vol. 361, page 466, Deed Records of Johnson County, Texas. You will purchase the property subject to this easement.

4.

On Page 65 there appears a deed executed by T. D. Nutt and others to the City of Cleburne, dated August 30, 1951, and recorded

in Vol. 384, page 282, which conveys the City a 100-foot of 6-inch sewer line beginning in North Anglin Street, and which continues northward 100 feet. You will purchase the property subject to this easement.

5.

The property under investigation has been surveyed by C. E. Recer, Registered Public Surveyor, and a copy of the survey plat is attached to this opinion. 

SUBJECT: Inspection of Jail facility by Mr. Dearing of the Jail

Standards Commission.

Mr. Dearing made his annual inspection of the jail facility today, May 23, and made the following verbal report: (His written report will be received at a later date)

Two permanent variances must be requested from the Standards Commission concerning the emergency operation of doors on the three isolation cells on the top floor and the lack of a floor drain in the kitchen. Mr. Dearing believes these variances will be granted.

His report will also state there is no intercom communication between these cells and the control board. A request for variance was not granted and the County will be required to install intercom communications from these three cells.

During the processing of prisoners to be admitted to the jail, the jailer will be required to spray the inmates personal clothing with a disinfectant spray.

The Life Safety Rules have been revised and will require a few minor changes in records keeping. Also required will be posting of emargency exit signs and a diagram of emergency escape routes in corridors.

Although it is no way concerns the Standards Commission, Mr. Dearing mentioned that we may not be in compliance with State law concerning the Caping of mental patients with no criminal charges against them -- not because of facility but lack of psychiatric staff. This was mentioned on a FYI basis.

Mr. Dearing also mentioned the availability of a sizable grant for the library to set up a library in the iail.

In compliance with Section 203 of the Highway Safety Act of 1973, a Statewide Program has been developed to inventory and improve passive protection at public railroad grade crossings within the State. This program will provide for signing and marking improvements at those public crossings where a need is defined by the State acting by and through the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation. Federal funding for such improvements is to be provided by Section 203 of the 1976 Highway Safety Act with State matching funds; no City or County funds will be required.

Districtwide projects, which include your jurisdiction, are proposed to make the necessary improvements. These projects will provide for the installation or upgrading of crossbuck signs, number of track signs, advance warning signs, and pavement markings to conform with the standards specified in the Texas Manual on <u>Uniform Traffic Control Devices.</u>

Since improvement needs may be designated at crossings within your jurisdiction, your participation in this program is recommended. Such participation will require the acceptance and return of this agreement.

By your acceptance of this agreement, signing or marking improvements designated in the proposed project can be made under the above mentioned funding. Existing passive protection devices found to be nonstandard or in poor condition will be salvaged and disposed of without credit to your jurisdiction. Upon completion of the project, the newly installed or upgraded devices, excluding crossbuck and number of track signs, shall become your jurisdiction's property and maintenance responsibility.





Dear Judge Altaras:

I have reviewed the question presented to me by the Commissioners Court which I understand to be: Whether or not the County would be liable if it approved a Plat on which development of property could increase the flow of surface waters upon and adjacent land owners.

The authority of the County Court to approve the recording of Plats is governed in Johnson County by Article 6626a, Vernon's Annotated Texas Statutes. By virtue of Section 3 of Article 6626a, Vernon's Annotated Texas Statutes, the Commissioners Court is authorized to make the following requirements prior to the approval of a Plat:

(a) To provide right of way on main artery streets or roads within such subdivision of a width of not less than fifty (50) feet not more than one hundred (100) feet.

(b) To provide for right of way on all other streets or road in such subdivision of not less than forty (40) feet nor more than fifty (50) feet.

(c) To provide that the street cut on main arteries within the right of way be not less than thirty (30) feet nor more than forty-five (45) feet.

(d) To provide for the street cut on all other streets or roads within such subdivision within the right of way to be not less than twenty-five (25) feet nor more than thirty-five (35) feet.

(e) To promulgate reasonable specifications to be followed in the construction of any such roads or streets within such subdivision, considering the amount and kind of travel over said streets. Hon. Tommy Altaras July 13, 1978 Page 2

(f) To promulgate reasonable specifications to provide adequate drainage in accordance with standard engineering practices for all roads and streets in said subdivision or addition.

(g) To require the owner or owners of any such tract or land, which may be so subdivided, to give a good and sufficient bond for the proper construction of such roads or streets affected, with such sureties as may be approved by the Court; and in the event a surety bond by a corporate surety is required, such bond shall be executed by a surety company authorized to do business in the State of Texas. Such bond shall be made payable to the County Judge or his successors in office, of the County wherein such subdivision lies, and conditioned that the owner or owners of any such tract of land to be subdivided will construct any roads or streets within such subdivision in accordance with the specifications promulgated by the Commissioners Court of such county. The bond shall be in such an amount as may be determined by the Commissioners Court, but shall not exceed a sum equal to Three Dollars (\$3.00) for each lineal foot of road or street within such subdivision.

It should be noted that such requirements do not allow the Court to consider the effect on down stream land owners of the construction of streets and/or houses on the water flow in natural water ways crossing the property to be subdivided. The Court may only establish specifications with reference to the adequate drainage for the streets and roadways to keep them clear of water.

A similar statute, Article 6626, controls the platting of property in Counties over 190,000 population and the cases cited under it would appear to have value precedent relating to Article 6626a. It would appear therefore, that this area is governed by Commissioners Court vs. Frank Jester Development Company, (Court of Civil Appears, 1947), 199 S.W. 2nd, 1004, wherein the Court held that where the dedicator has done all that is required by the Statute, the authorization of the filing of the Plat by the Commissioners Court becomes a mere administrative duty, the performance of which could be compelled by an action in mandamus.

It would therefore be my opinion based on the <u>Jester Development Company</u> case and the specific wording of Article 6626a, that if the dedicator has complied with the provisions of Article 6626a relating to streets and roadways, the Commissioners Court would have no choice but to approve the Plat irrespective of the effect on down stream owners of an increased servitude for surface water. It logically follows that since the Commissioners Court would have no authority to deny the plat, it could incur no liability for the approval of the plat which would appear to be required by law.



CLEBURNE PLANT DISASTER PLAN

I. OBJECTIVES

- 1. To save lives and prevent injuries.
- 2. To minimize property damage.
- 3. To insure continuity of operations.
- 4. To maintain good press and public relations.

II. SCOPE

The Plan of Organization for plant protection is set up to cover local emergencies such as fire and explosions. It has been left sufficiently flexible to permit implementation under various operating and shut down conditions as well as emergencies such as threatening disaster with advance warning.

III. GENERAL

Because of the great variance in numbers of persons available on the day shift compared to those available on night shifts and shut down periods, it is necessary that full responsibility as well as secondary duties be assumed by top personnel immediately on the scene. Line organization is then followed as additional persons arrive and become available to take over. When a disaster occurs, emergency procedures are required to take care of injuries and damage, otherwise protect property and handle public interest.

In the event of on-plant disasters, prompt assistance if needed is available from the Cleburne Fire Department (645-2211), the Johnson County Sheriff's Department (645-2501), the Cleburne Police Department (645-2424), Johnson County Memorial Hospital (645-3360), the Cleburne City Manager (645-2457), and the State Department of Public Safety (641-9945). All of these should be notified immediately.

All gates to the Cleburne Plant must be immediately manned. All Gates on the County Road if installed will be closed and manned by GOEX personnel until county officials can take over.

No fire in or around an explosive building is to be approached by anyone if there is any danger of an explosion.

Evacuation and avoidance of explosive buildings in the vicinity of an explosion must be as prompt and complete as possible to effect the least exposure of personnel as long as any possibility of danger exists.

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In the event of a fire in a truck loaded with explosives,

- The truck can be moved to a place where other installations will not be threatened or
- 2. Fire fighting efforts will continue, or the equipment and area promptly abandoned.

SAFETY OF PERSONNEL IS OF FIRST IMPORTANCE.

IV. CONTROL CENTERS

The Main Office is designated as the Central Control Center. In the event the Main Office should become untenable, the Central Control Center may be moved to the Breakroom clothes change building.

V. RESPONSIBILITY

The Plant Manager is responsible for the protection of personnel, buildings and the dissemination of information to news media. In the absence of the manager, line organization will be followed. In the event of serious fire or explosion, GOEX management is to be notified as promptly as possible following the securing of operations and danger areas.

VI. PROCEDURES

Following an incident, plant personnel at all locations shall proceed rapidly to the breakroom.

It is important that all persons report promptly to facilitate a count to determine if anyone is missing.

During regular working hours the plant manager or the next in line under him will give directions for the emergency such as:

- 1. Lock all gates and post a person at the main gate and office gate to let only the required people inside the plant. Only employees and emergency vehicles will be admitted through the large gate. All government agents, such as OSHA, BATF, FBI, after showing proper I.D. will be sent to the control center to await a company official.
 - Set up a point of contact with any fire chiefs, police chiefs, sheriff, etc. that may be assisting.
 - 3. News media personnel with photo I.D.'s will be admitted through the main gate into an office set up for press only with a telephone if possible. They will be told that company officials will release information to them as available and release news at least every thirty minutes. Harrold Owen, David Levey, Don Samanie, Dean Owen, and John Herron are the only personnel authorized to make news releases.
- 4. Establish one message center for all messages to flow through. The office reception area if possible.

PROCEDURES ON SHIFTS OTHER THAN DAY SHIFTS

On operating night shifts the Supervisor is in complete charge until superseded and will proceed as follows:

- 1. Phone or send alarm at once this insures the response of maximum help.
- 2. Organize a Fire Company and act promptly. Arrange for an accounting of all personnel on the shift.
- Call Cleburne Fire Department. (If needed)

- 4. Designate a person to man the Guard House Gate. This is especially inportant in the event of an explosion.
- 5. Call Management.

When the plant is shut down with only the Watchman, the first act of importance is to notify the Fire Department and members of Management.

VII. PUBLIC RELATIONS

Prompt dissemination of information to news media following a disaster is very important in order to prevent exaggerations, distortions and misunderstandings which often arise when the public is denied facts within a reasonable time.

News writers and photographers can be expected to arrive at the plant very soon after a disaster has occurred. A reporter assigned to cover a disaster cannot return to his office empty handed. It is better, therefore, that he obtain his information from an authorized source, preferably the Plant Manager.

News personnel should be escorted to the Control Center and supplied with available facts even though this information is fragmentary. The names of employees injured seriously or fatally, however, should not be given out prior to notification of families. News personnel usually understand this procedure and cooperate. An exception may be made if a prolonged delay develops in reaching the relatives of the injured. It may then be wiser to proceed with the publication of the names. It is important to reassure families of the uninjured as soon as possible in order to relieve their anxiety. The governing factor should be this:: will releasing the names of the injured result in greater or less anxiety among relatives of employees? In any event, efforts should be continued to contact personally relatives of the injured in order to avoid, if at all possible, their first learning of a casualty through broadcasts or press reports.

Newsmen should be assured that we will supply them with additional information as it becomes available and that we will escort those wishing to visit the scene of the disaster as soon as security permits. Explain our reasons for requiring visitors to be accompanied at all times by a member of supervision. They are the responsibility of the Company while they are on Company property and must be protected in every way possible.

Make available to the news personnel the telephones, desks, etc. of the Control Center.

BOMB THREAT

Should a bomb threat be received during regular working hours, notice will be given to the lines.

Plant personnel will proceed immediately to the assembling points assigned for the various work areas. Police and the F.B.I. will be notified and an investigation will be arranged for by the person on the plant property in highest authority.

Should a bomb threat be received during a time when the plant is not in regular operation, management must be notified immediately for implementation of the above procedure.

To aid in possible identification, the person receiving the call should:

- !-

- a. Keep the caller on the line as long as possible. Ask the caller to repeat the message. ATTEMPT TO RECORD EVERY WORD SPOKEN BY THE PERSON MAKING THE CALL.
- b. If the caller does not indicate the location of the bomb, or the time of possible detonation, the person receiving the call should ask the caller to provide this information.
- c. It may be advisable to inform the caller that the detonation of a bomb could result in death or serious injury to many innocent people.
- d. Pay particular attention for any strange or peculiar background noises such as motors running, background music and the type of music and any other noises which might give even a remote clue as to the place from which the call is being made.
- e. Listen closely to the voice (male female), voice quality, accents and speech impediments.





It is expressly understood that the Commissioners Court does not purport hereby to grant any right, claim, title or easement in or upon this right-of-way. A permit is hereby granted for continuous use. All work on the County right-of-way shall be performed in accordance with County instructions. The installation shall not damage any part of the County roads, and adequate provisions must be made to cause minimum inconvenience to traffic and adjacent property owners.

The herein named County will at no time be held liable for any damages to said water line while improving and maintaining County roads.

III.	UTILIZATION OF FUNDS: Funds paid to the Contract Agency by the TYC

these Community Assistance Program funds may be utilized to enrich, supplement and otherwise support basic juvenile probation services, it is the intent of the Community Assistance Program that they be used primarily for the provision of community-based alternate care programs and services not formerly financed by county government. More specifically, the TYC Community Assistance Program is intended to support the development of program service alternatives coming between the judicial dispositions of probation supervision and TYC commitment.

These alternatives may include the following:

- A. Residential Programs:
 - 1. Halfway Houses
 - 2. Residential Treatment Centers
 - 3. Foster/Group Home Care
- B. Non-Residential Services:
 - 1. Intensive Supervision Units
 - 2. Psychological/Psychiatric Counseling
 - 3. Day Care Programs
- C. Individual Program Planning (Diagnosis and Post Disposition Plan)

Community Assistance Program funds may be expended in the following manner:

- 1. Salary plus fringe benefits for persons who provide direct services to youth being referred to the county juvenile probation agency and were hired because of the increased need. Fringe benefits should be consistent with those paid for all county employees.
- Travel reimbursement for those employees being paid with Community Assistance funds for travel directly related to this program.
- Professional fees which are necessary for the placement of children in residential programs.
- 4. Contract services which may include purchase of residential and non-residential services from public or private non-profit agencies.

- 5. Direct purchases for youth, such as clothing, food, school supplies, etc. when no alternative source of funding is available.
- 6. Any other expenses not falling into the above categories, but used in the area of child care services may be allowable subject to prior TYC approval.

By entry into this contract with the TYC, the Contract Agency agrees to assist the TYC in the development and use of alternative programs for youthful offenders not requiring institutionalization. In no event will these funds be used outside the area of child care services.

In the event that the Contract Agency has made commitments in excess of its cumulative monthly base rate during its Fiscal Year 1978 contract with TYC, such excess commitments shall be carried forward into the term of this contract. Any such excess commitments shall be included in the computation of payment due under this contract as if the said commitments occurred during the first month of the term of this contract.

Computation of payment due the Contract Agency shall be made according to the following formula:

Cumulative monthly base rate - cumulative commitments = cumulative diversion;

Cumulative diversion x \$4,500.00 = total earned to date of computation;

Total earned to date - total of previous payments = monthly earnings.

The Contract Agency agrees that any and all payments hereunder are subject to the continuing availability of funds appropriated by the Legislature for the Texas Youth Council Community Assistance

Program. In the event that such funds are not available for any portion of the term of this contract, the Contract Agency agrees to maintain its efforts as described in Paragraphs I and II hereof, in consideration for continued eligibility for funding under any future Community Assistance Contract.

V. FISCAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- MAINTENANCE OF EFFORT: Maintenance of local fiscal effort is required. Reduction in local fiscal support of a program violates the maintenance of local fiscal effort requirement and shall result in termination of TYC funding.
- SEPARATE ACCOUNTABILITY: Contract Agency agrees to establish and maintain separate accountability for all contract funds, including a separate recording of contract expenditures.
- FISCAL REGULATIONS: The fiscal administration of contracts shall be subject to the rules, regulations, policies and procedures of the TYC Community Assistance Program Diversion Contracts, Manual (August, 1978).
- 4. REPORTS: The Contract Agency shall submit, at such time and in such forms as may be prescribed, monthly and final financial reports. Failure to submit required reports within the prescribed time constraints may result in unnecessary delays or in the termination of funding for the program.
 - A. Monthly Reports Monthly expenditure reports shall be submitted to TYC no later than the 10th day of the month following the month being reported. Reports should summarize program expenditures under the six categories in which program funds may be utilized. These categories are:
 - Personnel
 - 2. Travel
 - Professional fees
 - 4. Contract services
 - 5. Direct purchase
 - 6. Other

Monthly reports will be used in conjunction with other reports to review and monitor contract programs and also assist the Contract Agency in measuring program progress.

- B. Final Report A final report will consist of a summary of all expenditures for personnel cost and for direct services purchased. The report will provide a breakdown of such expenditures in each of the treatment programs listed in Section III, Utilization of Funds, above. The final report is due thirty (30) days after the contract period or at the end of the one year continuance period if used. Forms for both the monthly and final reports will be provided by TYC.
- only for expenditures for personnel cost or for direct services as long as such services are received during the contract period. In no case may contract funds be expended for services received prior to the contract period. At the close of the contract period, an additional l year period will be allowed for the expenditure of all funds recieved under this contract. At the end of that time, any funds that have not been spent will be forfeited.
- PROJECT COMPLETION: The Contract Agency agrees to file a final report thirty (30) days after expenditure of contract funds.
- 7. EXPENSES NOT ALLOWABLE: Contract funds may not be expended for (a) items not part of the contractual services, personnel cost, travel or supplies and direct operating expense as stated in Section III of Contract; (b) purchase of land and construction of buildings or implementation of improvements thereon, or payment of real estate mortgages or taxes; (c) purchase of equipment or other capital expenditures.
- 8. MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS: Financial records and supporting documents generated by this contract shall be retained, with the oversight of the County Auditor, in compliance with Article 1651, V.A.C.S. Statistical records, required reports and all other records pertinent to the program or any component part thereof shall be retained by the Contract Agency for three (3) years from the date of the Contract Agency's submission of the final expenditure report. The records must be retained beyond the three-year period if audit findings have not been resolved.

Provisions to this effect must be included in all contracts, subcontracts, or other arrangements for implementation of this program or any component thereof.

- 9. INSPECTION AND AUDIT: The State of Texas, Texas Youth Council, or any of their duly authorized representatives shall have access to any books, documents, papers, and records pertinent to this program for the purpose of making audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcripts. A provision to this effect shall be included in all contracts, subcontracts or other arrangements for implementation of the program or any component thereof.
- 10. CONTRACT AGENCY AGREEMENT: It is understood and agreed by the Contract Agency that any funds received pursuant to this contract shall be subject to the above standard conditions, special items, and other policies and rules issued by the Texas Youth Council for administration of TYC programs.

VI. PROGRAM STANDARDS:

- The Contract Agency agrees to adhere to the TYC Community Assistance Program Diversion Contracts Manual (August, 1978) where these are not in conflict with the provisions of this contract, in which case the contractual provisions will be adhered to.
- 2. The Contract Agency shall be licensed by the Texas Department of Human Resources for those programs which are under the licensing authority of the Department of Human Resources.
- 3. The Contract Agency shall comply with all state licensing laws which apply to the Agency and with applicable local ordinances and building codes regarding fire, safety and health requirements.
- TYC shall make periodic onsite visitations and reviews of Contract Agencies to assure the provision of quality services, to ascertain compliance with the TYC Rules, Regulations and Standards governing this program and to ensure that the program is providing the quantity and mode of services for which TYC funding is being provided.

These visits may include examination of client records, observation of programs in operation, interviews and meetings

with program staff, client and family interviews and meetings with appropriate community officials, agencies and organizations.

- 5. The Contract Agency shall provide services in compliance with all applicable provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Education Amendments of 1972, and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.
- VII. This contract may be terminated by either party giving 30 days written notice to the other party hereto of the intention to terminate.



In 1976, the Texas Criminal Justice Information User's Group, working in conjunction with the Texas Criminal Justice Division (TCJD), completed specification development, requests for bids, bid evaluation, and vendor selection for the development of the proposed Highspeed Teletype Network. The teletype terminal selected was the International Communications Corporation (ICC) 40+ Model which has been in use in many law enforcement agencies throughout Texas.

The bid price of the terminal is \$8,847 plus \$105 a month for maintenance, resulting in a total first year system's cost of \$10,107. Eighty-five percent (85%) of this cost will be paid through LEAA/CJD grant funds and fifteen percent (\$1,516) of cash match paid by the local participating agency. An administrative charge of \$50 will be requested to cover accounting costs which include reimbursement to vendors, billing, invoicing and maintaining an inventory. In addition to the cash match required, local governments should plan to pay all expenses for line mileage beginning October 1, 1979, and supplies from the very start. Line mileage and supply costs will vary from agency to agency, but an annual estimate of \$600 and \$500 respectively should be realistic. During the second and subsequent years, no grant assistance is anticipated, so local governments should plan to absorb all expenses for maintenance, line mileage, and supplies.

We were notified at an earlier date that your law enforcement agency would like to obtain a Highspeed Teletype Terminal, thus we are requesting that the following steps be taken at your earliest convenience:

- o Passage of a City Council/County Commissioner's Court resolution (a <u>sample</u> is enclosed) authorizing participation in the Highspeed Landline Communications Network Program and authorizing the expenditure of the necessary 15% cash match of \$1,516. and \$50 for administrative costs. Billing for local dollars will be conducted prior to ordering the equipment from ICC.
- The appropriate officer(s) of your City/County will need to certify that County will comply with all of the normal special conditions (copy enclosed)

which are placed on this project in addition to the special conditions relating to the Federal Privacy and Security Regulations.

o Please return one copy of the signed resolution and one copy of the signed Special Condition Certification by November 15, 1978.

I have examined an abstract of title in one part with last certificate dated October 18, 1973, by Cleburne Land and Abstract Company, said abstract purporting to cover title to the following described property, to-wit:

Block 24, Original Cleburne, also known as Market Square

and I find title to be good in Johnson County, Texas, subject to the following exceptions:

1. On page 42 of the Abstract, I find a deed from A.T. Lodle et ux, Cora to N.M. Pittman describing a portion of this property as being of a North-South dimension of 54 feet and a East-West dimension of 82 feet. The property under discussion herein is located on the Southwest corner of Block 24. At the time Ir. Pittman transfered the property to P.C. Chambers, et al by Warranty Deed in Volume 76, page 194 of the Deed Records of Johnson County, Texas, as reflected by the deed contained in page 43 of the Abstract, Nr. Pittman conveyed the same piece of property refered to in his deed from Mr. Lodle, but referred a North-South dimension of 60 feet, not 54 feet.

REQUIREMENT: None. It is my feeling that there is a question on the status of title of the 6 feet gap as reflected in the deeds referred to above. It would appear that there is a possibility that this 6 feet is still owned by the Λ . T. Lodle estate and I could not recommend the construction of any improvements on that portion of Block 24.

2. On page 45 of the Abstract is referenced a deed from P. C. Chambers et al to Johnson County, Texas, wherein the consideration is stated as \$5.00 and the further consideration of supplying sufficient grounds for a Market Place in the City of Cleburne, Texas. There is a possibility that consideration could fail on this portion of the tract which constitutes the most southerly 60 feet of Block 24 in the event that the property was used for purposes which would impede its use as a market place.

REQUIREMENT: None. Due to the possibility of failure of consideration I could not recommend the construction of any permanent improvements on the most Southerly 60 feet of Block 24.

- 3. This Abstract does not show that a recent survey has been made. It is not necessary for a survey to be made in order to have good title to the property, however, you should check your lines and corners carefully and determine who is in possession of the property and by what rights.
- 4. We do not and cannot pass on any possible forgeries in signatures, identities of persons in chain of title, false notary certificates, abstractor's omissions, matters not covered in the abstract, and matters of like manner.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE NORTH CENTRAL TEXAS COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS TO PURCHASE HIGHSPEED LANDLINE COMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT AND SERVICES IN BEHALF OF THE COUNTY OF JOHNSON

WHEREAS, highspeed telecommunications equipment in the County of Johnson is presently nonexistant or inadequate; and

WHEREAS, the structure of the statewide highspeed teletype system has been determined and development of regional systems will continue on the basis of the statewide concept established by the Texas Criminal Justice Division, Office of the Governor, State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Criminal Justice Information Users Group in conjunction with the Texas Criminal Justice Division has submitted bidding specifications to prospective vendors, and after considering the bids, has determined the low compliant bidder; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of this Commissioners Court that the best interest of the citizens of the County of Johnson will be served by participating in this cooperative program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF THE COUNTY OF JOHNSON THAT:

- 1. The County of Johnson desires to participate in the highspeed teletype network expansion by acquiring a highspeed terminal and adjunct equipment.
- 2. The County of Johnson is eligible to participate in the Highspeed Teletype Network Expansion by virtue of compliance with the Criminal Justice Division's established funding criteria, namely, that this agency
 - (1) Has 24 hour, 7 days per week, dispatching. (Dispatching is defined as having one or more people on duty to operate radio and terminal equipment.)
 - (2) Has at least 18 hour dispatching 7 days per week and has 10 full-time commissioned and certified police officers or deputies. (Agencies qualifying under this criterion may not include the chief of police or sheriff nor other city or county officials who may be commissioned and/or certified, e.g., city manager, director of public safety, assistant city manager, etc.)
 - (3) Can demonstrate that more than 96 messages are presently being generated per day by the department. Supporting information and/or statements are attached to this resolution.
- 3. The North Central Texas Council of Governments is authorized to enter into binding contract with the low compliant vendor and to purchase telecommunications equipment in behalf of the County of Johnson.
- 4. This County understands that the Texas Criminal Justice Division is providing 85% funding and that the amount of \$1,566.00 is our matching share for the purchase of the equipment and the administrative cost of the project.

- 5. This County understands and accepts the special conditions placed by the Texas Criminal Justice Division and the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration on the receipt of government funds for telecommunications equipment.
- 6. To indicate the County's desire to participate in this program, a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the North Central Texas Council of Governments.
- 7. This County's matching share will be forwarded to the North Central Texas Council of Governments upon notice of grant award and invoicing.

- (3) Clean the outside surface of all the marble. (M.F.W. Extracting Method).
- (4) Refill or tuck-point all the marble mortar joints.

 (Pressure Gun Method).
- (5) Polish all the marble. (Hand Tool Method)

 Company agrees to furnish all the equipment, labor, and material,

Company releases County of any personal injuries that might occur while completing said work, and County agrees to pay Masonry Specialist, the contract price, at the completion of said work.
