Atwood, Commissioner of Precinct No.1, (Commissioner, A.J. Lambert, Absent) Loyd H. Reese, Commissioner of Precinct No.3, and B.B. Aldridge, Commissioner of Precinct No.3, and County Judge, Tommy Altaras.

Invocation was given by B.B. Aldridge, Commissioner Precinct No. 4.

Due to the absence of County Tax Assessor-Collector, Dennis McWilliams, no action was taken on the contract for appraisal services with Pritchard and Abbot.

John Street, Service Officer for the Disabled American Veterans, Johnson County Chapter, appeared before the court advising that an article printed in the Johnson County News on June 7, 1979, was misleading and that he disagrees with the phrasing of the second paragraph in that the misinformation referred to does not state whether same was from a National source, or local source, and that he had received numerous complaints from Johnson County Veterans in regard to the article.

He further stated that he had received some complaints from Veterans who said that the Service Officer could not, or would not, help them. he stated that the Veterans need service, but he was here only to advise the court about the problem. Article from newspaper following:

Mrs. Mary Shaw, Mrs. Gaylord Sturgess and Mrs. Pat Lock, appeared before the court with a petition from citizens of the Liberty Chapel Independent School District, requesting that the district be consolidated with the Cleburne Independent School District. After a discussion by the Commissioners Court, the petition was withdrawn and Commissioner Atwood made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Loyd Reese, to authorize the County Clerk to check the law and details of calling an election and report his findings at next regular meeting of the court. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Reese and seconded by Commissioner Aldridge to appoint Commissioner C.W. Atwood to represent the Commissioner court at a meeting with the Federal Bureau of the Census, to be held at the Chamber of Commerce Building, on June 12, 1979.

All voted aye.

Mr. E. L. Meredith, Chairman of the Johnson County Committee on Aging (assisted by Polly Von Tungelin, Director,) presented the court with a program and the needs for the year 1980. He specifically requested that the County contribute \$10,000.00 for 1980 under 16-B, in which the Federal share is \$92,000.00 and local contributions must be \$20,000.00.

County Judge, Tommy Altaras, advised the committee that the matter would be considered at the budget hearing for 1980 - but that the County was faced with may financial obligations for 1980, and could not promis that the request could be approved.

A motion was made by Commissioner Atwood and seconded by Commissioner Reese to authorize the County Auditor to sell the County computer system to the First Municipal Finance Corporation, at no loss to the County, and to authorize the County Auditor to lease the equipment from First Municipal Finance Corporation on a year to year basis.

All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Reese and seconded by Judge Altaras to authorize Sheriff Stuart Huffman to purchase 100 shoulder patches for Deputy Sheriff uniforms, at a cost not to exceed \$129.00.

All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Aldridge and seconded by Commissioner Reese to authorize payment of monthly bills as read by the County Auditor.

All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Aldridge and seconded by Commissioner Reese to approve the minutes, as read by the County Clerk.

All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Reese and seconded by Commissioner Aldridge to adjourn.
