Atwood, A.J. Lambert, Commissioner of Precinct No.2, Loyd H. Reese, Commissioner of Precinct No.3, B.B. Aldridge, Commissioner of Precinct No.4 medically excused, Tommy Altaras, County Judge and Joe L. Townes, County Clerk.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lambert and seconded by Commissioner Reese to adopt proposal that the East side of Highway 174 as the division line for Justice of the Peace Precinct, as outlined:

A motion was made by Commissioner Atwood and seconded by Commissioner Lambert that entire Main Street to the center of the courthouse be in Justice of Peace Precinct No.4, as outlined.

Precincts No. 1 and 4 to follow Commissioners' lines, except instead of using the railroad tracts through the City of Cleburne, follow Main Street through Cleburne, and outside the City Limits follow the Commissioners' boundaries. Entire Main Street is within Precinct No.4 to the center of the Courthouse.

All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Atwood and seconded by Commissioner Reese that Constable Precinct Lines be the same as Justice of the Peace Precinct lines.

All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lambert and seconded by Commissioner Reese that the East side of Highway 174 be a part of Justice of the Peace Precinct No.2.

All voted aye.

24, 25, 28, 29, and 30.
