#### TWIN BRIDGES - NEWS RELEASE

The Commissioners Court of Johnson County is pleased to announce that it has acquired all the parcels in regard to the Twin Bridges near Burleson, Texas. There were five parcels involved. Three of which were negotiated and two were condemned through special commissioners.

Ken Boyd, a Cleburne Attorney, represented the Johnson County Commissioners in all five acquisitions. The cost of the five parcels, attorney fees and special commissioners fees was \$31,127.50.

Elvis Shockley, Resident Engineer for the Texas Highway Department, advised that the contracts for construction of the bridges will be let in July and that construction should be complete around January, 1986. Johnson County Precinct, 3 who's Commissioner is Jimmie W. York, will be responsible for 20 percent of the construction cost and the State and Federal Government will bear the remaining 80 percent. At the present time the approximate total cost estimate is \$ 582,470.00.

A report on the Sub-Courthouse Annex by Danny Butler should be finished in about two (2) weeks. Mr Butler advised that the stucco that was originally planned for the overhang is too heavy and ask approval to put decorated metal trim instead. This would cut the cost by about \$5,000.00. A motion was made by Commissioner B. B. Aldridge and seconded by Commissioner Roe to put the decorative metal trim on the overhang of Sub-Courthouse instead of stucco.







CONTRACT FOR THE COLLECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF JOHNSON

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into by and between JOHNSON COUNTY, acting herein by and through its governing body, joined by the State Property Tax Board, hereinafter called First Party, and GEORGE J. PRAPPAS, hereinafter styled Second Party.

I.

First Party agrees to employ and does hereby employ Second Party to enforce by suit or otherwise the collection of all delinquent state taxes, penalties and interest within JOHNSON COUNTY owing to the State of Texas, provided current year taxes falling delinquent within the period of this contract shall become subject to its terms on the first day of July of the year in which the same shall become delinquent except that suits resolved before the first day of July must include current year delinquent taxes.

II.

Second Party is to call to the attention of the collector or other officials any error, double assessments or other discrepancies coming under his observation during the progress of the work, and is to intervene on behalf of First Party in all suits for taxes hereafter filed by any taxing unit on property located within its corporate limits.

III.

First party agrees to furnish delinquent tax statements to Second Party on all property within the taxing jurisdiction. Second Party will furnish forms for said statements on request and will assume responsibility for having penalties and interest computed on statements before such statements are mailed to property owners.

IV.

Second Party agrees to file suit on and reduce to judgment and sale any property located within the County against which a tax lien would prevail provided First Party will furnish the necessary data and information as to the name, identity, and location of the necessary parties, and legal description of the property to be sold. Second Party agrees to sue for recovery of the costs as court costs as provided by Tex. Prop. Tax Code §33.48 (Vernon 1979).

V.

Second Party agrees to make progress reports to First Party on request, and to advise First Party of all cases where investigation reveals taxpayers to be financially unable to pay their delinquent taxes.

VI.

First Party agrees to pay to Second Party as compensation for services required hereunder fifteen (15%) percent (not to exceed twenty (20) percent) of the amount collected of all delinquent taxes, penalties and interest of the years covered by this contract, actually collected and paid to the collector of taxes during the term of this contract as and when collected. All compensation above provided for shall become the property of the Second Party at the time payment of taxes, penalties and interest is made to the collector. The collector shall pay over said funds monthly by check.

VII.

This contract is drawn to cover a period beginning *January 1, 1985* and ending when the term of office of the current Commissioners' Court terminates; provided however that Second Party shall have an additional six months to reduce to judgment all suits filed prior to the date last mentioned, and provided further that Second Party shall handle to conclusion all suits in which trial court judgments are obtained during the period of this contract and which are appealed by any party. In consideration of the terms and compensation herein stated,

Second Party hereby accepts said employment and undertakes the performance of this contract as above written. First Party and the State Property Tax Board shall have the right to sooner terminate this contract for cause, giving thirty (30) days written notice of such intention, with a statement of the cause or reasons for such termination, after giving Second Party a reasonable opportunity of explaining or rectifying the same. In case of such termination, Second Party shall be entitled to receive and retain all compensation due up to the date of said termination.

VIII.


This contract is executed on behalf of First Party by the presiding officer of its governing body who is authorized to execute this instrument by order heretofore passed and duly recorded in its minutes.

Dear Mr. Goodnight:

This letter is in reference to your conversation with Melinda Nickless in the Elections Division concerning the commission of Mr. Vernon Asher.

According to the information you provided, Johnson County used to elect two justices of the peace in precinct 1. Accordingly, each justice was designated by Place 1 and Place 2 pursuant to Article XVI, Section 65 of the Texas Constitution. In 1980, Mr. Asher was elected to Justice of the Peace, Precinct 1 Place 1, for a four year term.

In 1981, the Commissioner's Court divided Justice of the Peace Precinct 1 into two justice precincts, those being Precinct 1 and Precinct 4, and provided for the election of only one justice in each precinct.

As a result of this order by the Commissioners Court, the place designations of the positions held by Mr. Asher and Mr. Post were dropped.

Article V, Section 18 of the Texas Constitution provides that when the Commissioners Court redistricts the justice precincts, those justices elected to office on or before the effective date of the order shall be entitled to continue to hold the office that they were elected. Since Mr. Asher was elected in 1980 to a full four year term, he was entitled to hold his elective office, Justice of the Peace, Precinct 1, Place 1, for four years.

In addition, the Commissioners Court created a vacancy in the office of Justice of the Peace, Precinct 4 when they redistricted the justice precincts. That office should have


been filled at the general election in 1982 for a four year term pursuant to Article XVI, Section 65. According to the records of this office, that office was not filled at the 1982 General Election.

The certificate of qualifications for county and precinct offices that we received from you stated that Mr. Vernon Asher was elected to the office of Justice of the Peace, Precinct 4. Since the office of Justice of the Peace could not have been on the ballot for a full term in 1984 under Article XVI, Section 65, this office will issue Mr. Asher his commission for an unexpired term.

Please be advised that the office of Justice of the Peace, Precinct 4 will be up for election to a full term in 1986 pursuant to Article XVI, Section 65 of the Texas Constitution.

WHEREAS, it has been made known to the Commissioners Court that the particular secretary performing any private work for the respective attorney is paid additional compensation by the attorney from his private funds and;

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Commissioners Court that the District Attorney, County Attorney, Assistant District and County Attorneys and County Judge remain in their offices in the Courthouse during office hours rather than be located in a private law office, and;

WHEREAS, in setting the salary for the County Attorney, Assistant District and County Attorneys and County Judge, the Commissioners Court considered and assumed that they would supplement their County salaries by conducting their private law practices under the guidelines set out above,

Now therefore be it resolved that the Commissioners Court of Johnson County, Texas, hereby acknowledges, ratifies and specifically elects to continue to permit the District Attorney, County Attorney, Assistant District and County Attorneys and County Judge to conduct

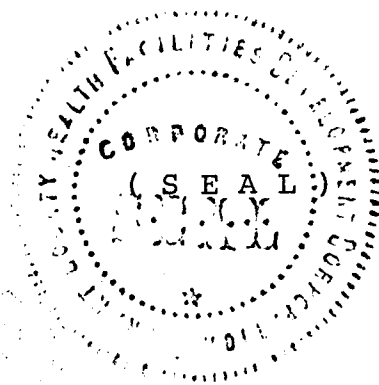



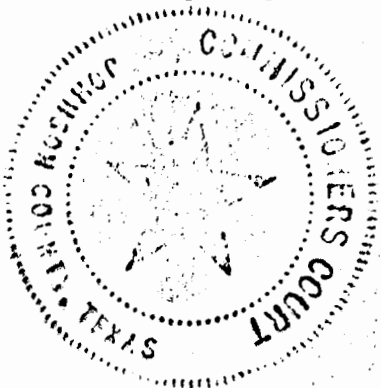

WHEREAS, Tarrant County Health Facilities Development Corporation (the "Issuer") was created under the auspices of Tarrant County, Texas, pursuant to the Health Facilities Development Act, art. 1528j, V.A.T.C.S. (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that the Issuer may finance health facilities to be located outside Tarrant County, in the City of Cleburne (the "City") in Johnson County (the "County"), with the consent of the City and the County; and



RE: TCDRS Sponsored Legislation (S.B. 546)

The Board of Trustees of the Texas County and District Retirement System has requested certain amendments to the statute governing the operations of the retirement system. The amendments have been introduced as Senate Bill 546 under the sponsorship of State Senator John Traeger of Seguin.

Senate Bill 546 consists of several technical amendments that either expand time limitations of the present law or correct or clarify the language of the present law. However, the bill also contains several substantive amendments that you will find of interest and these are described below.

1. New Optional Benefit Eligibility Plan for Service Retirement, Disability Retirement, Vesting and Deferred Service.

Effective January 1, 1986, TCDRS counties and districts may adopt, if retirement program funding allows, a ten (10) year length-of-service requirement for service retirement on attainment of age sixty (60). The county or district would also authorize a ten (10) year length-of-service requirement for vesting and a ten (10) year/age sixty (60) requirement for Deferred Service Retirement. In addition, a new early retirement provision would be added and would allow retirement any time the sum of a members attained age and length-of-service equals eighty (80), provided the member has earned at least ten (10) years credited service.

The ten (10) year length-of-service requirement for retirement and vesting are becoming the standard for both public and private pension plans and each TCDRS county or district will

be advised in the fall of this year (providing the amendment is effected by the legislature) if the funding level of its retirement program will allow adoption of the eligibility requirements discussed above.

2. Deferral of Federal Income Tax on TCDRS Contributions.

For some time, there was no provision in the Internal Revenue Service Code that would allow tax preferential treatment for TCDRS contributions made by employee-members. However, Internal Revenue Service interpretation of the provisions of Section 414 (h)(2) of the Code (a section commonly referred to as "employer pick-up") allows, under certain conditions, the deferral of federal income tax on employee contributions to TCDRS.

To secure favored tax treatment for employee contributions, TCDRS Trustees are seeking a complying amendment to the TCDRS Act and simultaneously applying to the Internal Revenue Service for the "qualification" of the TCDRS plan. Consequently, effective January 1, 1986 (assuming legislative approval of the amendment), or upon qualification of the plan with IRS if that occurs later, employee contributions to TCDRS will in effect reduce the employees' compensation subject to federal income tax. Those of you familiar with tax-sheltered annuity programs or deferred compensation programs will recognize the similarity of treatment that will be accorded TCDRS contributions under section 414 (h)(2) of the Code.

3. Increase the "regular" or guaranteed interest rate to 7%.

Since the System was started in 1967, the "regular interest" rate (or guaranteed rate) has been increased several times, from an original 3% to the present 4½% per annum, because the interest return obtainable on investments of the System has risen materially from time to time. At present the average return on all assets in the System is approximately 11½%.

While the Board of Trustees is able to distribute the interest earnings above 4½% as "supplemental" interest in crediting the individual accounts of members and the accumulating funds of the subdivision, and in paying extra checks to annuitants, the statute still requires the use of the 4½% rate in calculating the monthly benefits at retirement of a member. The amendment proposes to raise the regular (guaranteed) rate from 4½% to 7% as to time periods ensuing after December 31, 1984. If the amendment is adopted, the board will adopt new annuity purchase rates using the proposed 7% rate. This will result in an increase in the monthly payments to persons retiring after October 1, 1985.

The amendment specifically provides that the increase in interest does not require recalculation of benefits in effect prior to October 1, 1985, but authorizes the Board to increase annuities in effect by not more than 12½%.

4. Timing of New Member Enrollment.

Our present law requires the enrollment of new members in TCDRS by the first day of the month following the first month of employment and, consequently, may deprive a member of credit for the first month of employment. Accordingly, an amendment is sought requiring the enrollment of new employees in TCDRS as of the first month of employment provided, of course, the employee is eligible for membership. If effected, this amendment will become effective when signed by the Governor, probably in June or July of this year.

5. Deferred Service Retirement Beneficiary.

An additional optional Deferred Service Retirement selection will be sought through amendment whereby a member, protected by Deferred Service Retirement, may designate a beneficiary without pre-selecting a plan of retirement and afford the named beneficiary the right to a retirement plan selection in the event of the death of the member before retirement.

6. Eligibility Period for Purchase of Military Service Credit.

Heretofore, the purchase of credit for military service was required to be made within the first year of eligibility; if amended, the statute would allow the purchase of military service credit at any point during membership and after a member becomes eligible for the purchase.

7. Extension of the Maximum Funding Period from twenty-five (25) to thirty (30) years.

Currently, member subdivisions cannot adopt a benefit structure that would extend the period over which current and prospective liabilities are being funded beyond twenty-five (25) years. Persuasive arguments exist that the twenty-five (25) year period is modestly but unnecessarily restrictive, and that a thirty (30) year funding period more closely approximates a conservative norm. Consequently, an adjustment in the funding period is sought.

8. Extended Supplemental Death Benefits Protection.

Employees of counties and districts which participate in the Supplemental Death Benefits Fund (term life insurance) remain covered by the terms of the program if injury or illness precludes employment provided they apply for extended coverage under the plan and that application is approved by the Medical Board. Since injury or illness may prevent the completion of an application, the statute will be adjusted to allow benefit payments to be made even if no application was submitted if the employee dies within six (6) months of the date last worked and evidence is provided that absence from employment was a result of the illness or injury leading to death.

We are, of course, hopeful that S.B. 546 moves smoothly as far as passage by the Legislature is concerned. There was much preparation involved in the drafting of this bill and we think the amendments are good ones for TCDRS.

I appreciate the work that the court is doing to upgrade the county sub-divisions. I feel the plat that you have in front of you goes even beyond what you have set out because I am able to have sewer and therefore am able to use city type lots even though the subdivision is in the country.

The following guidelines will be used in the development since we do have sewer and are using curb and gutters, and concrete streets are currently planned.

1. Some of the lots will incorporate a new concept of zero lot line of side with minimum 10' feet between side building on other side.
2. Set back will be 25' from property line which is 35' from the street which will allow 2 cars to park off street.
3. The main street will be 50' wide with the actual pavement being 40' wide.
4. Side streets will be 40' wide with pavement of 30' wide.  
Note: Most of the cities in the Dallas-Fort Worth area are using 25' pavement, but I felt this was too narrow to permit smooth flow of traffic.
5. The addition will be restricted and we believe it will be an asset to the county.
6. This is a planned development with Single family lots, Single family attached lots, Fourplex lots, multi-family land and some commercial land.
