BE IT KNOWN that on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1986 the Honorable Commissioners Court of Johnson County met in a special called session with all members present.

A public hearing was held to consider revision of the Johnson County Subdivision Regulations and Private Sewage Facility Regulations. Persons attending the meeting were asked to sign their names, addresses and telephone numbers on a list.

The public hearing was recessed until 9:00 A.M. on Friday, May 9, 1986 for further public comment on proposed rules.

The public hearing was continued on May 9, 1986 and recessed until 9:00 A.M. on May 16, 1986 in order to give persons attending the meeting additional time to read the proposed rules and give them additional comments about the proposed revisions.

The public hearing was continued on Friday, May 16, 1986 and recessed at 12:00 P.M. until 9:00 A.M. on May 19, 1986, because the County Judge was scheduled to attend a meeting of the Palo Pinto Community Service Corp. at 1:30 P.M. in Weatherford to consider continuation of the commodity distributions program.

The Commissioners Court reconvened at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, May 19, 1986 and received additional comments from those attending about the proposed revisions. Thereafter, the following motions were acted upon.

Subdivision Rules and Regulations of Johnson County,  
Texas

A motion was made by Comm. Aldridge and seconded by Comm. York to approve the revised Subdivision Rules and Regulations for Johnson County, Texas as presented. See attached.

Those For: Comm. York and Comm. Aldridge

Those Opposed: Comm. Russell and Comm. Roe

Judge Bridewell broke the tie by voting for the motion.

Comm. Roe advised that he would like for the lots with perk tests 60 or below, to be  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre and if it perk test is above 60, the lot will have to be one acre. He also asked that his vote be changed to show that he voted for it and would give his support.

Comm. Russell also advised that he will also support the motion passed but wanted his vote to stand as is.

The final vote is as follows:

FOR: Comm. Aldridge, York, Roe and Judge Bridewell

OPPOSED: Comm. Russell
