BE IT KNOWN that on the 22nd day of June, 1998, the Honorable Commissioners Court of Johnson County, Texas, met in regular session at 9:00 a.m. with all members present in the Courthouse, in the City of Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas, and following the Invocation led by Pastor Mike Mizell of the Bethel Temple Assembly of God Church Cleburne, Texas and the Pledge of Allegiance, the following items were considered.

V. <u>PUBLIC PARTICIPATION</u>

Bill Miller praised Commissioner Ron Harmon, Precinct #2 for the hard work that he has done for the County. Beverly Short, spoke on behalf of Dorothy Swartz who could not be present due to illness, to present 250-300 signatures showing citizen support for the Sheriff's Prisoner Work Program.

1. <u>APPROVAL OF BILLS</u>

A motion was made by Comm. Thompson, seconded by Comm. McFall to approve the bills as submitted by the County Auditor.

All voted aye, motion passed.

2. <u>ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RECEIPT OF THE COUNTY AUDITORS REPORT</u> <u>TO COMMISSIONERS COURT</u>

County Judge, Roger Harmon acknowledged receipt of the County Auditors Report to the Commissioners Court.

A motion was made by Comm. Harmon, seconded by Comm. Carpenter to approve the minutes of the May 18 & 19, 1998 meeting.
