an annual salary of \$22,400 per year; to adjust the administrative assistant position, held

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by Mary Cashion, to a senior administrative assistant, changing the classification from a grade 13 to a grade 15 with a \$4,000 salary increase to be paid from the General Fund, effective May 16th 2004; and to increase Jerry Webber's salary by \$2,000 to be paid from the General Fund. Due to the retirement of Becky Williams, there will be no impact on the budget. Jerry Webber and Mary Cashion's supplement will decrease by the same amount of the increase from the general fund.
