8. CONSIDERATION TO DESIGNATE COUNTY PERSONNEL TO MAKE BUDGET TRANSFERS UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE 111.070c(2)-PRECINCT #1

Comm. McFall, seconded by Comm. Carpenter, made a motion to designate the County Judge, to make Budget Transfers under certain conditions pursuant to the *Local Government Code 111.070c 2* with the maximum amount of \$1,000.00.

Comm. Carpenter, seconded by Comm. Thompson, made a motion to approve the Interlocal Agreement between McLennan County and Johnson County regarding the payment salary supplement to the Justices on the 10th Court of Appeals.
