Detective Steve Shaw from the Johnson County Sheriff's Office spoke in reference to the nuisance at 2000 Tepar Lane, Cleburne, Texas. Detective Shaw stated that Mr. Stig

Wennerstrom is the property owner; that Notice of Violation was sent by certified mail and 1st class mail to Mr. Stig Wennerstrom. After the 45 day Abatement period, a Class C

Misdemeanor was filed. The Misdemeanor case was heard in Justice of the Peace Court,

Precinct #4. Mr. Wennerstrom did not appear and a Failure to Appear warrant was issued. The

Property has over grown grass, weeds, scattered trash and piled debris, a dilapidated mobile home and the roof of the garage is falling off. Detective Shaw has provided photo exhibits of the property. Detective Shaw stated that an attempt to clean up the property was made but the dilapidated mobile home and garage remain on the property.

Jim Simpson, assistant County Attorney stated that proper notice was given and that little has been done to resolve the issue. He advised the Commissioner's Court to find the property to be a violation pursuant to *Section 343* of the Texas Health and Safety Code and to authorize the Abatement. He also stated he felt they should be given additional time to remove the structures and for any additional clean up necessary.

Attorney Bob Rockett stated that he represents Mr. Wennerstrom and that a contract had been entered into with Legendary Mobile and Modular Services. He stated that this company would be going out this week and clean up and remove the structures on the property. He said the delay was due to the recent large amount of rain.
