BE IT KNOWN that on the 11th day of April, 2011, the Honorable Commissioner's Court of Johnson County, Texas, met in Regular Session at the Johnson County Courthouse thereof, in the City of Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas, for the purpose of transacting any and all business that may lawfully be brought before the same. The meeting was called to order at 9:05 A.M., with all members present, and following the Invocation led by Johnson County Attorney, Bill Moore, and the Pledge of Allegiance, the following items, having been lawfully posted and filed for record in the Office of the County Clerk on April 7, 2011 at 1:18 P.M., were considered:

1. <u>PRESENTATION OF LENGTH OF SERVICE PINS FOR COUNTY</u> <u>EMPLOYEES</u>

The Commissioner's Court opened a Public Hearing at 9:20 A.M. to discuss:

Detective Steve Shaw spoke in reference to Chapter 343 of the Texas Health & Safety Code, the premises located at 5713 Robert Cir., Alvarado, Texas 76009, has been identified as a public nuisance and **Teresa Ann Sparks** has been identified as the person responsible for causing or maintaining a public nuisance on the premises. This case began on July 20, 2010 due to overgrown grass and weeds, which had previously been presented in Commissioner's Court for an open swimming pool. The Commissioner's Court had Precinct #3 fill in the swimming pool because the owner, Teresa Ann Sparks, could not be located. Ms. Sparks has since been located in Tennessee and has been sent the letters required by law concerning this property. Detective Shaw did speak with Ms. Sparks prior to the case being presented to Judge Jacobs, Precinct #3. Ms. Sparks said she had hired Tony Salmon to abate the property for her. Detective Shaw spoke with Mr. Salmon and he informed Detective Shaw he would require payment before the work was done. Ms. Sparks never made payment and she did not appear for court. Judge Jacobs issued a failure to appear citation and at that point the case was started over as a public nuisance case. Detective Shaw revisited the property on April 2, 2011 and it was not abated. Ms. Sparks did not appear for court today. The hearing was closed at 9:22 A.M.

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Detective Steve Shaw spoke in reference to Chapter 343 of the Texas Health & Safety Code, the premises located at 3805 Shady Ln., Joshua, Texas 76058, has been identified as a public nuisance and Wells Fargo Mortgage (% Andrew D. Hohensee, Violation **Specialist**) has been identified as the person responsible for causing or maintaining a public nuisance on the premises. This case began on August 16, 2010 due to overgrown grass, weeds and scattered debris on the property. When the investigation began, David and Wilma Evans were identified as the owners. Once they were located, Mrs. Evans informed Detective Shaw that the property went back to Wells Fargo Bank in April 2006 but nothing has been filed with the County Clerk's Office so it still shows the Evans as the owners. Detective Shaw checked with the Tax Office and the taxes have been paid by Wells Fargo Bank. Proper notification was sent by certified mail to Wells Fargo and was received. Detective Shaw has dealt with Wells Fargo Bank with previous properties and they have always been very good about replying to letters and emails and taking care of the properties. In this case no reply has been received. Detective Shaw revisited the property on April 2, 2011 and it was not abated. No one from Wells Fargo Bank appeared in court today. The hearing was closed at 9:24 A.M.
