A motion was made by Commissioner Thompson and seconded by Commissioner Hadley, that \$5000.00 be transferred from the General Fund to the Officer's Salary Fund. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Thompson and Roland voted "Aye".

A motion was made by Commissioner Wyatt and seconded by Commissioner Roland that all properly approved accounts be approved and paid. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Thompson and Roland voted "Aye".

A motion was made by Commissioner Thompson seconded by Commissioner Roland that the Tax Assessor and Collector be authorized to reassess the valuation of 50 acres in the J. Wallace Survey, Abst. No. 863, assessed in the name of J. H. Underwood and Mrs. Zerlina Reefer for all years delinquent at a valuation of \$15.00 per acre and to accept taxes on said valuation. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Thompson and Roland voted "Aye".

A motion was made by Commissioner Wyatt, seconded by Commissioner Thompson that the Board of Equilization meet on May 19, 1943. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Thompson and Roland voted "Aye".

A motion was made by Commissioner Hadley, seconded by Commissioner Wyatt that the Court recess. subject to the call of the County Judge. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Thompson and Roland voted "Aye"

The Commissioners' Court of Johnson County, Texas met on May 19, 1943 as a Board of Equilization and each subscribed to the following oath:

"I, Roy Anderson, County Judge, Roy Wyatt, Commissioner Prect. #1, H. Olin Hadley, Commissioner Prect. #2, Dallas Thompson, Commissioner Prect. #3, and M. W. Roland, Commissioner Prect. #4, each a member of the board of equilization of Johnson County, for the year A. D. 1943, hereby solemnly swear that in the performance of my duties as a member of such board for said year, I will not vote to allow any taxable property to stand assessed on the tax rolls of said county for said year at any sum which I believe to be less than its true market value, or, if it has no market value, then its real value; that I will faithfully endeavor and as a member of said board will move to have each item of taxable property which I believe to be assessed for said year at less than its/market value, or real value, raised on the tax rolls to what I believe to be its true cash market value, if it has a market value, and if not, then to its real value; and that I will faithfully endeavor to have the assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation within said county stand upon the tax rolls of said county for said year at its true cash market value, or if it has no market value then its real value. I further solemnly swear that I have read and understand the provisions contained in the Constitution and laws of this State relative to the valuation of taxable property, and that I will faithfully perform all the duties required of me under the Constitution and laws of this State. So help me God."
