BE IT REMEMBERED THAT at a Regular Meeting of the Commissioners' Court of Johnson County, Texas, held on the 14th day of October, A. D. 1946 the following members were present: Honorable Roy Anderson, County Judge, Commissioner Wyatt, Precinct #1, Commissioner Hadley, Precinct #2, Commissioner Maddox, Precinct #3, Commissioner Roland, Precinct #4, and A. T. Griffin, County Clerk. Among other things they did the following:

A motion was made by Commissioner Wyatt and seconded by Commissioner Roland that all properly approved accounts be allowed and ordered paid. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Maddox and Roland voted "Aye".

A motion was made by Commissioner Wyatt and seconded by Commissioner Roland that the Treasurers Quarterly account having been checked and found correct, be approved. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Maddox and Roland voted "Aye".

A motion was made by Commissioner Wyatt and seconded by Commissioner Roland that the Delinquent Tax Roll covering the years 1939-1945 inclusive be approved. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Maddox and Roland voted "Aye".

A motion was made by Commissioner Wyatt and seconded by Commissioner Roland that the Tax Assessor be authorized to reassess the valuation on the W 2/3 of lot 3 in block 525 of the City of Cleburne, assessed in the name of Mrs. W. S. Watts, and to accept \$240.65 and 6% interest in full settlement of taxes against the same. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Maddox and Roland voted "Aye".

It is ordered by the Commissioners' Court of Johnson County that the sum of (\$1500.00) Fifteen Hundred Dollars be appropriated and the same is hereby appropriated out of the funds of the county to be used as part salary of a Home Demonstration Agent, to be assigned to work in this county by the Extension Service of the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas.

This appropriation shall become available on Jan. 1, 1946, or as soon thereafter as the Extension Service of the A. and M. College of Texas shall place an agent in said county for duty, and shall be paid out in monthly installments to said agent upon written order duly signed by an authorized representative of said extension Service.

This appropriation shall be continuous annually until the Commissioners' Court or the Extension Service of the A. and M. College of Texas shall decide to discontinue same, and the
