NOTICE OF NUISANCE TO BE ABATED PURSUANT TO PUBLIC NUISANCE ABATEMENT PROCEDURES FOR JOHNSON COUNTY. TEXAS

In accordance with Chapter 343 of the Texas Health & Safety Code:

To: JP Morgan Chase Bank (c/o WHHGP Management, LLC)

You are hereby provided written notice of the following:

You have been identified as the owner, lessee, occupant, agent, or person in charge of the premises located at 3512 CR-607, Alvarado, Tx. 76009, and the person responsible for causing or maintaining a Public Nuisance on the property.

The specific conditions that constitutes the nuisance on this property are:

- 1) Maintaining the premises at 3512 CR-607, Alvarado, Tx., in a manner that creates an unsanitary condition likely to attract or harbor mosquitoes, rodents, vermin, or disease-carrying pests.
- 2) Allowing weeds to grow on premises in a neighborhood if the weeds are located within 300 feet of another residence or commercial establishment.

THE PERSON RECEIVING THE NOTICE SHALL ABATE THE NUISANCE BEFORE THE 31st DAY AFTER THE DATE ON WHICH THE NOTICE IS SERVED

Failure to abate the nuisance may result in the following:

- 1. Abatement by Johnson County;
- 2. Assessment of costs by Johnson County to the person responsible for causing the nuisance when that person can be identified: and
- 3. A lien against the property by Johnson County on which the nuisance exists, if the person responsible for causing the nuisance has an interest in the property.

HEARING

A hearing will be held on <u>December 27, 2010</u>, at 9:00 o'clock A.M. in the Commissioner's Courtroom on the second floor of the Johnson County Courthouse located at 2 North Main Street, Cleburne, Johnson County, Tx. [A date of a regularly scheduled Commissioner's Court meeting not less than 31 days following the date the person was served with the notice to abate the nuisance.] The hearing may be continued or reset to another date by the County Judge, or in his absence, by any Johnson County Commissioner.

The Johnson County Commissioners Court will hold a public hearing to determine if a Public Nuisance should be abated. Upon a finding that a Public Nuisance exists and has not been timely abated, Johnson County may:

- A. Access the cost of abating the nuisance, the cost of legal notification by publication, and an administrative fee of not more than \$100.00 on the person receiving notice under Section 343.022 of the Texas Health & Safety Code; or
- By resolution or order of Commissioners Court, access the cost of abating the nuisance, the cost of legal notification, and an administrative fee of not more than \$100.00 against the property on which the nuisance exists.

Johnson County is entitled to accrue interest beginning on the thirty-first (31st) day after the date of the assessment against the property at a rate of ten percent (10%) per year.

A Johnson County official, agent, or employee charged with the enforcement of health, environmental, safety, or fire laws may enter any premises in the unincorporated area at a reasonable time to inspect, investigate, or abate a nuisance or to enforce these procedures.

A court of competent jurisdiction in Johnson County, Texas, may issue any order necessary to enforce these procedures authorized pursuant to Chapter 343 of the Texas Health & Safety Code.
