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**COMMISSIONERS COURT GRANTING AN EXEMPTION UNDER SECTION 262.024, LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, FROM THE BIDDING REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 262.023, LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, UPON THE COMMISSIONERS COURT FINDING THAT THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT SERVICE OFFERED BY HELPING OPEN PEOPLE’S EYES, INC. (H.O.P.E.) IS AN ITEM THAT CAN BE OBTAINED FROM ONLY ONE SOURCE**

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The Johnson County Commissioners Court met on August 14, 2017, in regular session for the consideration that the purchase of a criminal justice substance abuse treatment service from Helping Open People’s Eyes, Inc. (H.O.P.E.) is an item that can be obtained from only one source. The Commissioners Court finds that this criminal justice substance abuse service can be obtained from only one source in that Helping Open People’s Eyes, Inc. is the only source providing criminal justice substance abuse treatment service in Johnson County, Texas and that the Commissioners Court may grant an exemption under Section 262.024, Local Government Code, from the competitive bidding requirements of Section 262.023, Local Government Code.

A motion was made by Commissioner Kenny Howell and seconded by Commissioner Jerry Stringer that: “The Commissioners Court finds that the purchase of a criminal justice substance abuse treatment service from Helping Open People’s Eyes, Inc. (H.O.P.E.) is an item that can be obtained from only one source and that the Commissioners Court grant an exemption under Section 262.024, Local Government Code, from the competitive bidding requirements of Section 262.023, Local Government Code, and enter an order to that affect, and that the Commissioners Court approve the purchase of a criminal justice substance abuse treatment service from Helping Open People’s Eyes, Inc. (H.O.P.E.) as an item that can be obtained from only one source in Johnson County, Texas”.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED:**




