The meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M. with all members present, and following the Invocation led by County Judge, Roger Harmon and the Pledge of Allegiance, the following items, having been lawfully posted and filed for record in the Office of the County Clerk on April 18, 2019 at 1:04 P.M., were considered:
