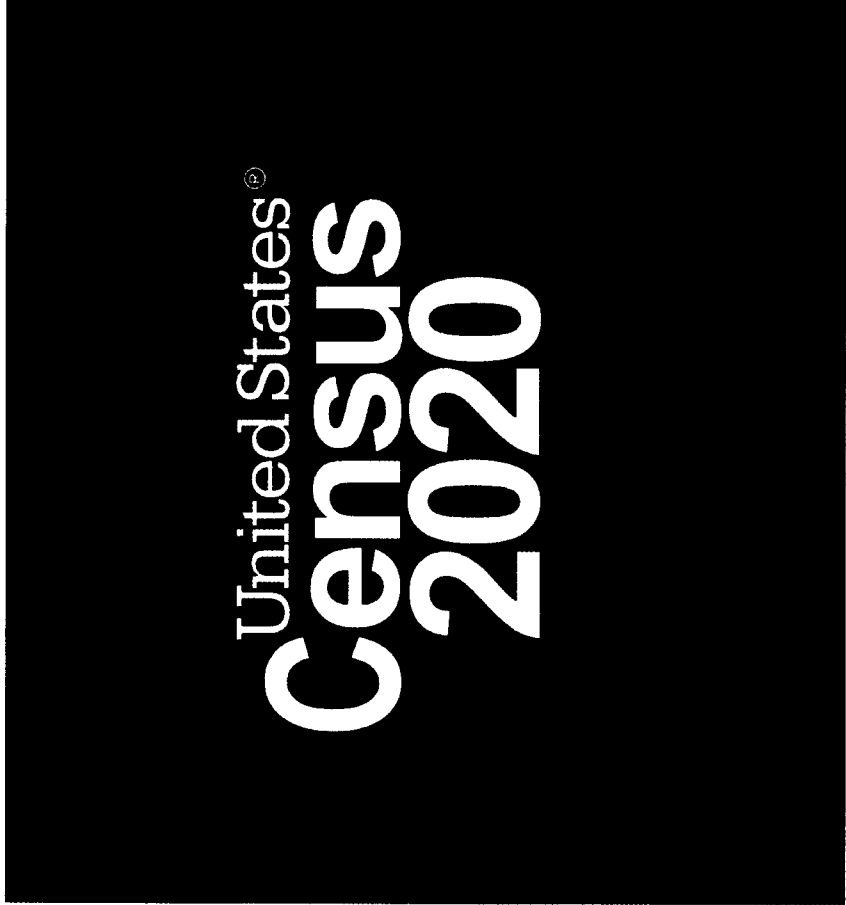

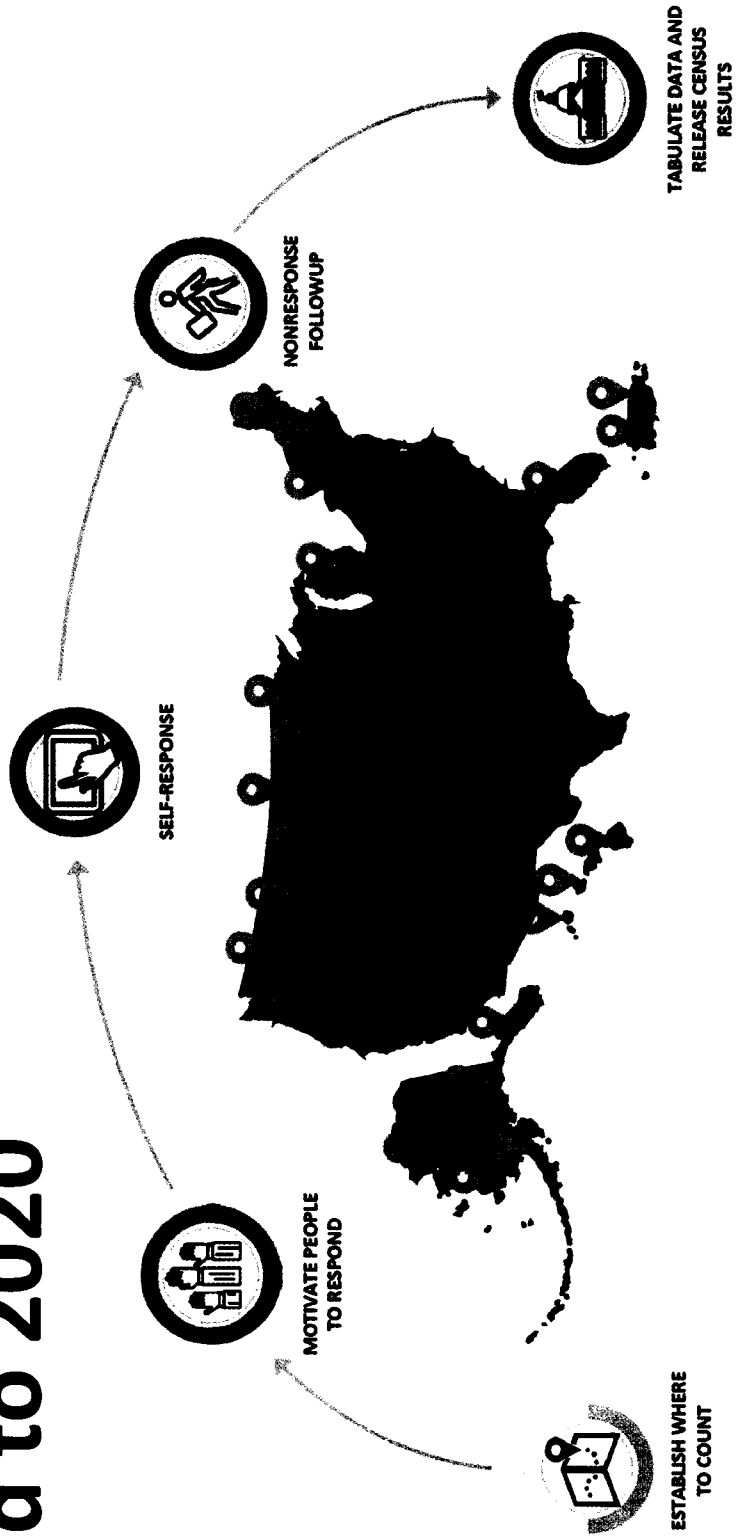

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# Why do we do the Census?

## Article 1, Section 2 of the US Constitution

*The actual enumeration shall be made within three years after the first meeting of the Congress of the United States, and within every subsequent term of ten years, in such manner as they shall by law direct.*

# Distribution of Federal Funds

States receive a portion of an estimated \$675 Billion from federally funded programs including:

- Rural Cooperative Development Grants through the USDA
- National School Lunch Program
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
- Federal Pell Grant Program
- Capital Assistance Program for Elderly Persons and Persons with Disabilities
- State Children's Health Insurance Program
- Head Start
- Community Development Block Grants
- Americorps
- Disabled Veterans' Outreach Program

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# Use of 2020 Census Data

- **Apportion** representation among states
- **Draw** congressional and state legislative districts, school districts and voting precincts
- **Enforce** voting rights and civil rights legislation
- **Distribute** federal dollars to states
- **Inform** planning decisions of federal, tribal, state and local government
- **Inform** organizational decisions (e.g., where to locate, size of market, etc.) of businesses and non-profits

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# The Census Is Confidential



## Title 13 of the U.S. Code states:

- The Census Bureau can not disclose any information that identifies persons, homes, or businesses for 72 years
- The information is collected for statistical purposes only
- Responses to the census can not be used against you in any way by any government agency or court
- The staff of the Census Bureau take an oath for life to protect personal information and may face heavy penalties for a violation.

**Title 44 of the U.S. Code allows the National Archives and Records Administration to publish the census information only after 72 years**

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**The goal of the 2020 Census is to count everyone once, only once and in the right place.**

## **The 2020 Decennial will:**

**Introduce** new technology to make it easier than ever for individuals to respond to the census

**Build** a more accurate address list and automate our field operations – all while keeping your information confidential and safe

**Conduct** a census of population and housing

**Disseminate** results to the President, the States, and the American People

# 4 Ways To Respond

## 1. Secure Internet

*New and Quick, Respond Online.*

It's safe, secure and confidential. Your information and privacy are protected. It's economical both for you and for the taxpayers. It's greener saving trees and it's user friendly—offering you help screens and the ability to review your answers.



## 2. Respond by Phone

Our numerators are ready to take you information question by question from the convenience of your phone from any location.



## 3. Respond by Mail

Wait until you receive your paper form through the mail or dropped at your residence. It can be filled out at home and dropped into your mailbox or post office.



## 4. In-person Interview

Our numerators will visit residences that choose not to self respond.



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# Key Census Dates

## 2019

**January – March:** Early Area Census Offices Open to Support Address Canvassing  
**June – September:** Remaining Area Census Offices Open to Serve as Base of Operations For Decennial  
**August:** Address Canvassing Begins

## 2020

**January:** Remote Areas of Alaska Counted Early Ahead of Inclement Weather  
**March:** Most Households Receive Invitation to Respond Online  
**April 1<sup>st</sup> :** Census Day  
**April:** Early Group Quarters Begins  
**May:** Non-Response Follow Up Begins With Households Who Have Not Responded  
**December 31<sup>st</sup> :** The Census Bureau Delivers Apportionment Counts to the President

## 2021

**April:** Data for Redistricting Purposes Delivered to the States  
**Throughout 2021:** Detailed Tabulation Tables Released on a Flow Basis

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# WHAT HAPPENS TO THE DATA

## REAL TIME UPDATES

Currently, the plan includes the release of real time self-response rates by Census tract so that communities can monitor how their community is responding. CCCs can mobilize to address low response rates in their areas.

## DECENNIAL DATA

Data for reapportionment is required to be delivered to the president by December 31, 2020. Data to the states for redistricting will be delivered by April 1, 2021. More detailed tabulation tables are released on a flow basis later in 2021.

## CENSUS COUNT QUESTION RESOLUTION (CQR)

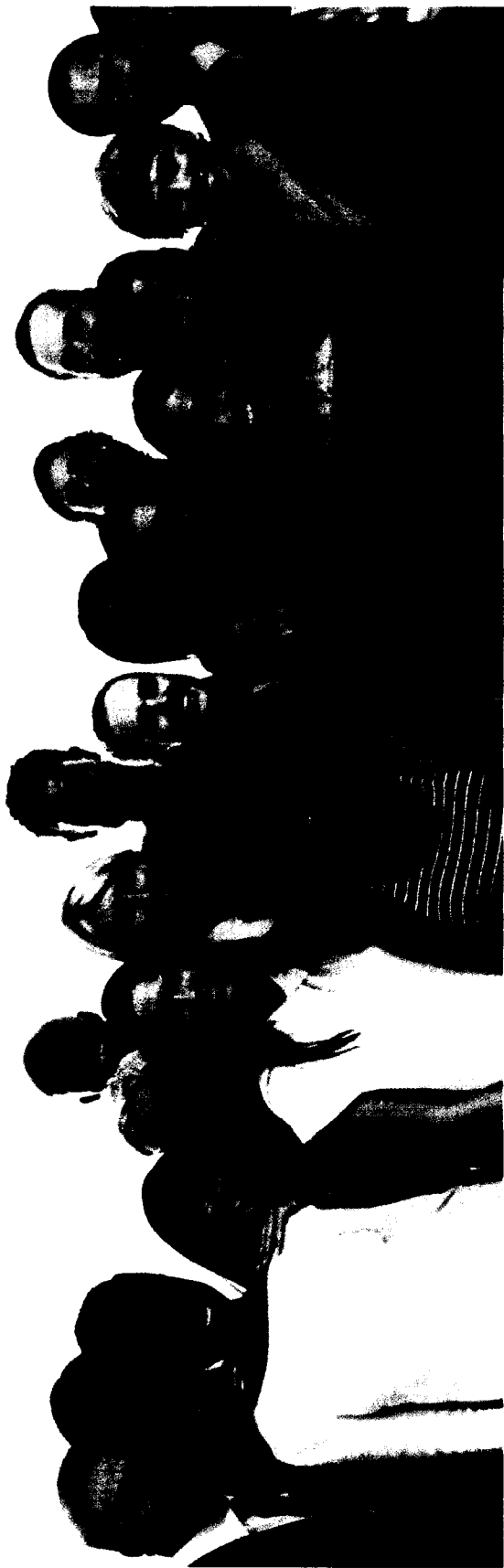
The Census Bureau established the CQR program by which State, local, and Tribal area elected officials may challenge their numbers. While we can issue a statement of correction, the official population count will not change.

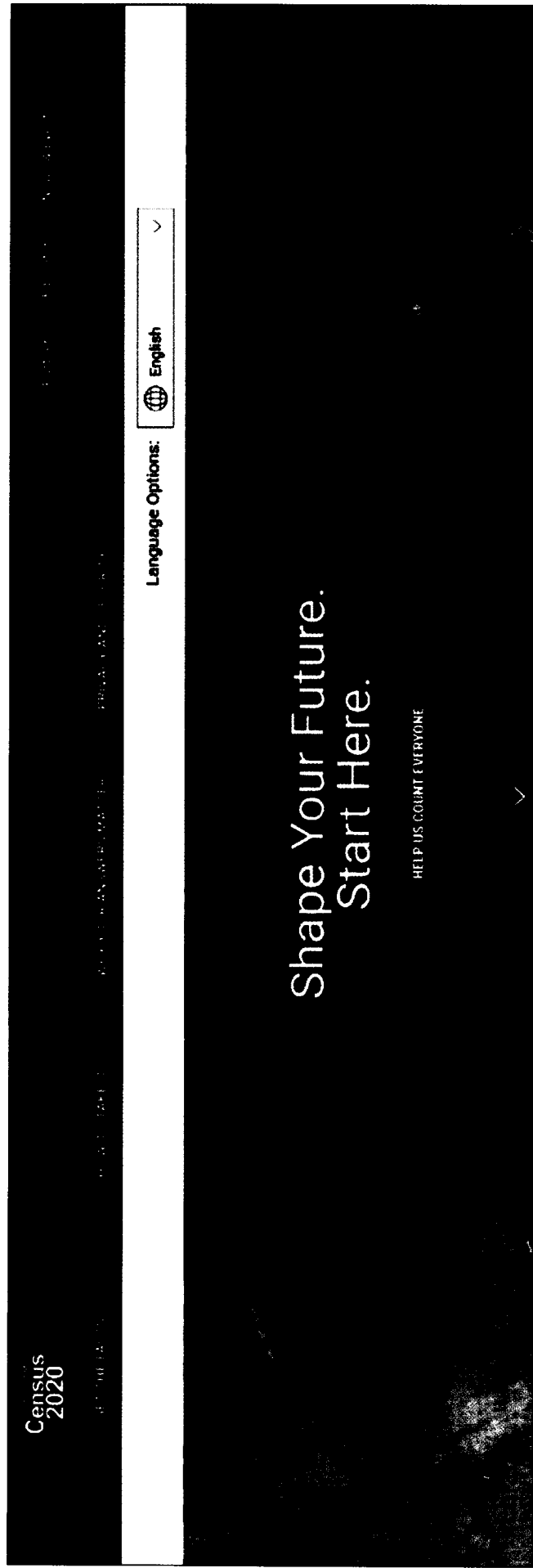
