#### **Project Description**

As the Covid -19 responses are increasing on a daily basis, we are seeing longer response times from ambulance providers throughout Johnson County, especially in the most southern areas. We are also experiencing heavy usage on Fire Department response vehicles in our northern areas of Johnson County which is creating wear and tear and apparatus.

Our southern area Fire departments of Johnson County, Grandview, Blue Water Oaks, Liberty Chapel, Rio Vista and Bono have the longest response times for ambulance arrivals throughout the county due to geographical locations. Currently, these departments respond as Basic Life Support, but have the personnel (Paramedics) that could respond Advance Life Support if they had the proper equipment. From January 2020 thru October 2021, there have been 1600+-EMS calls for service. The average response time for these departments is 10+- minutes with an average response time from ambulance provider 15+- minutes.

With the enhanced ability to provide Advanced Life Support to this region, this should dramatically enhance patient outcomes.

Several Fire Department vehicles currently used for medical responses are actually Brush-Grass fire trucks that are equipped to fight fires. When they are used for a medical responses, they are not available for a fire response. Having a smaller SUV type vehicles for a medical response will allow for fire apparatus to be available for fire calls and reduce they wear and tear on them for a longer response life.







We, Johnson County ESD No. 1 are also experiencing heavy usage on Fire Department response vehicles in our northern areas of Johnson County which is creating wear and tear on apparatus. Two ESD Fire Department vehicles are currently being used for medical responses are actually Brush-Grass fire trucks that carry 300 gallons of water and other equipment needed to fight fires. When they are used for a medical responses, they are not available for a fire response. The third SUV type vehicle would be placed in service at ESD Administration Office that would be able to respond to areas where no first response is Available or not responding. This would be manned by ESD EMS/Operations Chief and/or Training Captain.

Having smaller SUV type vehicles for medical responses will allow for fire apparatus to be available for fire calls and reduce the wear and tear on them for a longer response life.
