ReInspire proposes to build a housing program for 8-10 young adults in Johnson County. Lack of safe and stable housing is an overwhelming obstacle for our young adults emerging from foster care, homelessness, and other circumstances. Twenty five percent of foster youth become homeless on their 18th birthday. In five years of operation, ReInspire has seen this first-hand. The need can not be overstated. We also know the difference-maker a program like this would be in Johnson County. For the youth served and the larger community that benefits from healthy contributing citizens. Young adults would have the stability and support they need to pursue and achieve goals. ReInspire services like life skills, job skills, and mentoring will all be part of the program. The name of this program is descriptive as we know such a program can support a young person's successful "launch" into adulthood. This program would not be a shelter. We will create a safe and stable place for young adults to live as they secure full time employment and/or higher education (inclusive of technical training and apprentice type programs). We would keep the program small to avoid stigma and keep quality high. ReInspire lives in Johnson County too. We can provide the support and expertise to support clients to grow into great neighbors and citizens. We have a number of community members, professionals, and local builders to support us with the development and construction phases.

Location in Johnson County will be identified once funding is awarded. We have two highly qualified and experienced local developer/builders supporting our efforts. We have identified a number of prospective locations.

We are requesting \$725,000 for this project to secure the location and build. The impact of this program will last for years to come as young adults move into full independence and new clients move in.

Twelve-15 months. We anticipate a 8-10 month construction phase once the location and plans are approved.

ReInspire is applying for assistance due to losses we experienced in 2020 -2021 due to Covid. These losses continue to impact our ability to serve in 2022. ReInspire was established in 2017 (IRS Status in Feb 2018). We are based in Johnson County and serve vulnerable teens and young adults in Johnson County. Our clients are youth aging out of foster care, youth who have been homeless, or experienced other adverse experiences that act as obstacles to success and stability. As a still-growing and rather new nonprofit, we entered 2020 with a lot of momentum from two successful county-wide fundraisers and other work we had done to build our revenue streams in 2019. In March of 2020, this momentum seemed to disappear overnight. However, we never closed our doors. Needs for our services increased dramatically as our young clients experienced the pandemic. In fact, ReInspire expanded services as other agencies closed and we responded to the needs of our young people. We continued to have costs and expenses with no income. ReInspire relies solely on grants, donations, and fundraisers to operate. Every area of income was impacted and greatly reduced, in some cases to 0. Successful fundraisers take years to build. The impact of 2020 only served to increase the losses- and burden- for 2021. We are still feeling the effects in 2022. These funds would allow us to recover financially as we continue to serve the youth in our communities.

ReInspire is based in and serves Johnson County.

Mentoring is a key component of our programs. Volunteer mentors provide real-world information and a chance for youth to build their networking skills and sense of community.




