ANTIQUÉ ALLEY TEXAS EVENT

---

WHEREAS, Antique Alley began in September of 1999 between downtown Grandview and downtown Cleburne via E. FM 4. About 2004, other towns requested inclusion in the Antique Alley event. The name of the event was modified to "Antique Alley Texas" (AAT) to better reflect wide-spread participation; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Cleburne, Venus, Keene and (Ellis County neighbors Maypearl and Waxahachie) Chambers of Commerce and Downtown Merchants Associations, and the Cities of Alvarado and Grandview proclaim the impact of the event is wide ranging, directly affecting tourism and commerce; and

WHEREAS, the event brings more motor vehicle and pedestrian traffic to Grandview, Cleburne, Keene, Alvarado, Venus, and includes Maypearl and Waxahachie (Ellis County); and

WHEREAS, the event is loosely organized by an all-volunteer association of small business owners, entrepreneurs, families, churches, and school organizations. The event occurs twice per year on the third Friday, Saturday and Sunday every April and September; and

WHEREAS, during the weekend event, visitors patronize ATM machines, hotels, motels, bed & breakfast venues, RV Parks and area State Parks, including restaurants, service stations, grocery, retail and department stores including multiple neighborhood yard sales and fundraisers; and

WHEREAS, the traffic count is heavier on FM 4, FM 916, Hwy 67 and downtown areas of said cities during the event than any other time of the year including the spike in the number of yard sales that scatters higher than normal traffic throughout the entire county; and

WHEREAS, the Johnson County Sheriff's Office Reserves and the Texas Department of Public Safety patrol the event causing drivers to slow down and practice safe driving; and


WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation reminds patrons there is NO parking on state highways as this is a safety issue. Motor vehicle operators are encouraged to adapt to conditions and lower driving speed; and




