Texas Size/Weight Limits

Texas has established size and weight limits for vehicles and loads moving with or without an oversize and/or overweight permit on Texas roadways and bridges.

- · Width is measured from the outside points of the widest extremities, excluding safety devices.
- · Height is measured from the roadbed to the highest point of the load or vehicle, whichever is higher.
- Length is measured from the foremost point of the vehicle or load, whichever extends further, to the rearmost point of the vehicle or load, whichever extends further.
- · Weight includes the weight of the vehicle or combination, plus the weight of the load being transported.



• An axle group must have a minimum spacing of 40 inches between axles within the group.

- Weight may not exceed the manufacturer's rated tire carrying capacity.
- The weight of two or more consecutive axle groups with an axle spacing of less than 12 feet between groups, will be reduced by 2.5% for each foot less than 12 feet.
- The weight for an axle group should be distributed equally between axles in the group to not allow more than a 10% weight difference between any two axles in the group.

Trunnion axles may have up to 30,000 pounds per axle if the trunnion configuration has two axles, eight tires per axle, the axles are at least 10-feet wide and there is at least five feet of spacing between the axles, but not more than six feet.

Travel on load-restricted roads requires that the axle and axle group weights be load-zoned. Load-zoned weight is 10% less

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Annual Over Axle/Over Gross Weight Tolerance Permits

How to Apply .

TxDMV issues annual over axle/over gross weight tolerance permits for the movement of divisible commodities. Vehicles, alone or in combination, may exceed the allowable axle weight by a tolerance of 10 percent and may exceed the gross weight by a tolerance of five percent. Tolerances are above the maximum allowed for the particular vehicle or combination and are enforced based on the "outer bridge" distance, not the vehicle's registered weight. This permit does not exempt any owner, motor carrier, operator, or driver from complying with any statute,



regulation, rule, order, or other legal requirement not specifically referenced in Transportation Code, Section 623.011 or 43 Texas Administrative Code, Section 219.30.

Vehicles and/or vehicle combinations may not exceed Texas legal size limits.

Note: Vehicles moving under this permit may travel on county roads and state-maintained roadways, excluding the Interstate Highway System, in those counties selected on the permit application.

If any segment in the State of Texas of United States Route 59, United States Route 77, United States Route 281, United States Route 84, Texas State Highway 44, or another roadway is designated as Interstate Route 69, a vehicle that could operate legally on that segment with this permit type before the date of the designation may continue to operate on that segment, without regard to any requirement under 23 U.S.C. 127(n).

NOTE: You must verify the size and weight limits needed BEFORE seeking a special permit.

View Texas Size and Weight Limits

Operating Authority Requirements

Prior to being issued a permit, you must have an Over Axle/Over Gross Weight Tolerance Permit Bond (Form 1753) in the amount of \$15,000 or an Irrevocable Letter of Credit on file with TxDMV.

During the permit application process, you must provide your USDOT Number. TxDMV will check the number against the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) system, MCMIS, for any out-of-service orders prior to permit issuance. The permit will be issued to the company name as it is listed for the USDOT Number.

An original copy of the bond must be on file with TxDMV. An electronic copy will not be accepted.

Additional Requirements

You may not operate your vehicle on a load-posted bridge if the gross weight of the vehicle and load, or the axles and wheel loads, are greater than the established and posted limits, unless the bridge provides the only public vehicular access to or from your origin or destination.

No law "requires" County vehicles to get permits unless they are going to exceed the weight limits. If you don't exceed the weight limits, you don't need the permit. The main thing that would require the permit is for travel on a load zoned road. For instance, all of the FM roads in Johnson County are zoned at 58,420 lbs gross weight. If a County truck is weighing over 58,420 lbs it will need the overweight permit to legally travel down that road.

The weight laws are below (regular and load zone).

Sec. 621.101. MAXIMUM WEIGHT OF VEHICLE OR COMBINATION. (a) A vehicle or combination of vehicles may not be operated over or on a public highway or at a port-of-entry between Texas and the United Mexican States if the vehicle or combination has:

- (1) a single axle weight heavier than 20,000 pounds, including all enforcement tolerances;
- (2) a tandem axle weight heavier than 34,000 pounds, including all enforcement tolerances;
- (3) an overall gross weight on a group of two or more consecutive axles heavier than the weight computed using the following formula and rounding the result to the nearest 500 pounds:

$$W = 500((LN/(N - 1)) + 12N + 36)$$

where:

"W" is maximum overall gross weight on the group;

"L" is distance in feet between the axles of the group that are the farthest apart; and

"N" is number of axles in the group; or

- (4) tires that carry a weight heavier than the weight specified and marked on the sidewall of the tire, unless the vehicle is being operated under the terms of a special permit.
- (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a)(3), two consecutive sets of tandem axles may carry a gross load of not more than 34,000 pounds each if the overall

distance between the first and last axles of the consecutive sets is 36 feet or more. The overall gross weight on a group of two or more consecutive axles may not be heavier than 80,000 pounds, including all enforcement tolerances, regardless of tire ratings, axle spacing (bridge), and number of axles.

- (b-1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, a vehicle or combination of vehicles that is powered by an engine fueled primarily by natural gas may exceed any weight limitation under this section by an amount that is equal to the difference between the weight of the vehicle attributable to the natural gas tank and fueling system carried by that vehicle and the weight of a comparable diesel tank and fueling system, provided that the maximum gross weight of the vehicle or combination of vehicles may not exceed 82,000 pounds.
 - (c) This section does not:
- (1) authorize size or weight limits on the national system of interstate and defense highways in this state greater than those permitted under 23 U.S.C. Section 127, as amended;
- (2) prohibit the operation of a vehicle or combination of vehicles that could be lawfully operated on a highway or road of this state on December 16, 1974; or
- (3) apply to a vehicle or combination of vehicles that operates exclusively:
 - (A) at a private port of entry;
 - (B) on private roads associated with the port of entry; and
- (C) across a public highway between private roads associated with the port of entry under a contract under Section 623.052.
- Sec. 621.102. AUTHORITY TO SET MAXIMUM WEIGHTS. (a) The executive director of the Texas Department of Transportation may set the maximum single axle weight, tandem axle weight, or gross weight of a vehicle, or maximum single axle weight, tandem axle weight, or gross weight of a combination of vehicles and loads, that may be moved over a state highway or a farm or ranch road if the executive director finds that heavier maximum weight would rapidly deteriorate or destroy the road or a bridge or culvert along the road. A maximum weight set under this subsection may not exceed the maximum set by statute for that weight.
- (b) The executive director of the Texas Department of Transportation must make the finding under this section on an engineering and traffic investigation and in making the finding shall consider the width, condition, and type of pavement structures and other circumstances on the road.
- (c) A maximum weight or load set under this section becomes effective on a highway or road when appropriate signs giving notice of the maximum weight or

load are erected on the highway or road by the Texas Department of Transportation.

- (d) A vehicle operating under a permit issued under Section <u>623.011</u>, <u>623.071</u>, <u>623.094</u>, <u>623.121</u>, <u>623.142</u>, <u>623.181</u>, <u>623.192</u>, <u>623.212</u>, or <u>623.321</u>, as added by Chapter 1135 (H.B. 2741), Acts of the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, may operate under the conditions authorized by the permit over a road for which the executive director of the Texas Department of Transportation has set a maximum weight under this section.
- (e) For the purpose of this section, a farm or ranch road is a state highway that is shown in the records of the commission to be a farm-to-market or ranch-to-market road.
- (f) This section does not apply to a vehicle delivering groceries, farm products, or liquefied petroleum gas.
