Johnson County would like to express our enthusiasm and convey our full support of the *Trinity River Authority of Texas Litter (TRA) and Illegal Dumping Initiative* project submitted by the Trinity River Authority of Texas. As the County Judge for Johnson County, I see an immense need for this project within our county and the Village Creek-Lake Arlington (VCLA) and Joe Pool Lake (JPL) watersheds. Throughout the development of the VCLA and JPL watershed protection plans (WPPs), stakeholders continually voiced concerns related to the prevalence of illegal dumping activity near Lake Arlington and Joe Pool Lake as well as the accumulation of floatable litter in waterways. VCLA and JPL stakeholders recommended best management strategies (BMPs) to address illegal dumping and litter accumulation for water quality improvement. Both WPPs have been accepted and approved by the TCEQ and EPA. The *TRA Litter and Illegal Dumping Initiative* project will support the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) and Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's (TCEQ) water quality restoration goals and is consistent with the WPPs stakeholder driven BMPs.

Johnson County would benefit from regional access to a litter trailer for cleanup events and a regional initiative to reduce illegal dumping which will allow **Johnson County** to support effective material management in their **county** and meet goals and objectives outlined under the NCTCOG Regional Solid Waste Management Plan.

Johnson County pledges its fullest support of the TRA *Litter and Illegal Dumping Initiative* project and highly recommends this project to the NCTCOG.
