RESOLUTION BY JOHNSON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT APPROVING SHERIFF'S LIST OF NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS THAT MAY BENEFIT FROM INMATE LABOR

WHEREAS, Article 43.10 of the Code of Criminal Procedure authorizes counties to utilize inmate labor to benefit political subdivisions and non-profit corporations within the County under certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, upon approval by the Commissioners Court, the Sheriff of the County may use inmate labor to assist designated non-profit corporations; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff, along with the Commissioners Court of Johnson County believe that the provision of inmate labor to the non-profit corporations listed below serves a public purpose to the benefit of Johnson County and to the political subdivisions located in whole or in part in Johnson County and its citizens;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Johnson County does hereby FIND that providing inmate labor to the non-profit corporations listed below serves a public purpose to the benefit of the County and to the political subdivisions located in whole or in part in Johnson County. Furthermore, Johnson County FINDS that the provision of said inmate labor is in the best interest of the public.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Sheriff of Johnson County is authorized, but not required, to provide inmate labor for the benefit of the following non-profit corporations so long as the labor provides a public service to Johnson County and to the political subdivisions located in whole or in part in Johnson County:

- Johnson County Sheriff's Posse;
- Cleburne Chamber of Commerce:
- Johnson County Children's Advocacy Center;
- Johnson County Heritage Foundation;

- Johnson County Cemetery Association;
- Friends of the Johnson County Historical Commission; and
- Chisholm Trail 100 Club.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Sheriff of Johnson County is authorized, but not required, to provide inmate labor of the benefit of Johnson County and to the political subdivisions located in whole or in part in the Johnson County, including but not limited to work details overseen by any Precinct office, the Facilities Management Department, or the Purchasing Department.
