- 3. Remove and replace brick mold as required.
- Remove and replace concealed blocking as required.
- 5. Remove panic hardware leaving push bar openers.
- 6. Add deadbolt lock to (a.) door of each set including mortise into fixed, (b.) door.
- 7. Attach head and foot bolts to (b.) door of each set. Match color to existing hardware as close as possible. County will have final approval.
- 8. Repair damaged doors offsite. This includes: Removal of damaged/poorly repaired panels, salvage any reusable material, dowel and glue new portions, stain interior, paint exterior of door if applicable, paint brick mold and reseal molding to masonry.
- 9. Daily cleanup of construction debris.
- 10. Protect all adjacent surfaces/finishes from damage during repairs.
- 11. Option of repairs in phases. Minimum of 2 sets each phase. (4 doors)
- 12. Johnson County will coordinate priority of repairs.

Good afternoon, Mr. Sibley,

Thank you for contacting the Texas Historical Commission regarding Johnson County's proposal to stain and repair doors located in the Johnson County Courthouse.

If the repairs can be considered routine maintenance, the work will not require an approved SAL Permit application. However, if you have any questions about how the work should be completed the county might want to submit a SAL Permit application to receive THC comments on the scope of work.

Maintenance activities are considered routine if they repair damages with materials and finishes that match the existing materials and finishes. The Johnson County Courthouse was restored with THCPP funding. At the end of the project the county received a completion report that provides information on types of stains and doors, wood species, glues, etc. Try to locate that information to assist with selecting the appropriate stain and finish.

For future reference, here some guidance the THC prepared for counties to assist with maintenance of their restored courthouses.
