Comm. Bailey stated that Governor Abbott called a Special Called meeting in Austin. He said that many bills had been vetoed and that 5,200 of the 9,000 bills introduced had a negative impact on local government. He stated that they need to work with the local representatives until the session is over.

Judge Boedeker thanked Comm. Bailey for his efforts.

Comm. Woolley stated that they averaged about 7 miles a day on foot and that most of it was up and down stairs. He stated that for the next court meeting, he would not be present and would instead be attending the NACo conference in Philadelphia. He added that he had also been appointed to the Environment, Energy & Land Use Policy Steering Committee and that he is hopeful to get NACo involved in some of the environmental issues in Texas.
