Spirit of Blue Safety Grant Program – Summary

Program Purpose and Focus

The Spirit of Blue Safety Grant Program provides critical safety equipment and, in some cases, training to municipal, county, and state law enforcement agencies. The program is designed exclusively for sworn, armed peace officers (including arson investigators). Fire departments and EMS agencies are not eligible.

The program supports officer safety through three main categories:

- 1. **Protecting Life** Items like ballistic vests, medical kits, hearing protection, traffic safety gear, and safety training.
- 2. **Projecting Force** Includes lethal and less-lethal weapons, targeting systems, lights, and firearms accessories.
- 3. **Creating Advantage** Tools such as uniforms, operational gear, communications systems, and intelligence/security equipment.

Grant Funding and Delivery

- Grants are typically 100% funded.
- Spirit of Blue procures the items directly; no funds are given to agencies.
- Agencies receive equipment or training, not money.
- Once a grant is awarded, agencies receive an official award letter and must follow internal approval procedures.
- Agencies must wait two years after receiving a grant before applying again.

Application Process and Timeline

- Applications are accepted year-round and are kept on file if not selected immediately.
- The 2025 application cycle is currently open, with awards beginning July 1, 2025.
- Unselected applications roll into consideration for 2026.
- Agencies must confirm they have the authority to apply and clearly explain how the request enhances officer safety.
- There is no required reporting, but agencies are encouraged to submit a photo upon equipment delivery.

Eligibility Criteria

- Only sworn, armed peace officer agencies are eligible (including arson investigators).
- Fire departments and EMS agencies are not eligible.
- Requested items must directly improve officer safety.
- Agencies that received a grant within the last two years are not eligible to reapply yet.

Fulfillment Process

• Spirit of Blue works directly with vendors to provide the awarded items.

- Delivery can take from a few weeks up to 12–18 months, depending on internal approvals.
- Grants expire if not accepted within 24 months of being awarded.

Program Importance

The program helps address safety needs for over 900,000 U.S. law enforcement officers. With limited municipal budgets and high risks in the field (over 125 officer deaths and 15,000 injuries annually), the grant program fills critical gaps in officer protection.

Grant Application Responsibilities

Deputy Cornelius will be responsible for the grant application preparation, obtaining necessary quotes and program follow-up. These efforts will be reviewed by the Sheriff's Office administration and the county auditor's office to insure compliance.

Summary

The Spirit of Blue Safety Grant Program:

- Delivers fully funded safety gear and training.
- Focuses on demonstrable impact on officer safety.
- Accepts applications year-round.
- Handles all procurement directly to reduce administrative burden on agencies.

Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation Grant Program – Summary

Program Purpose

The program provides funding for **life-saving equipment** and **public safety education tools** to a wide range of public safety organizations. Eligible applicants include:

- Fire departments
- EMS organizations
- Law enforcement agencies
- Public safety agencies
- Nonprofits
- Schools

What Is Not Funded

The program does **not** fund:

- Firearms, tasers, or any use-of-force equipment
- Body cameras, drones, riot gear, exercise or fitness equipment
- Recording devices, stop sticks, security systems, or patented/refurbished products
- Equipment already purchased (no reimbursements)

Grant Amounts

- You can request up to \$50,000.
- Most grants awarded are between \$15,000 and \$35,000.
- No matching funds are required.
- Partial funding may be awarded if other funding is already secured.

Application Timeline

- Grants are reviewed quarterly.
- Only **600 applications** are accepted per quarter.
- Decisions are typically made within **two months** of each quarterly deadline.
- Do **not contact** Firehouse Subs restaurants or their call center to inquire about your application.

Reapplication Policy

- An organization can **only submit one application per quarter**.
- If awarded a grant, you must wait two years before applying again.

Required Attachments for Application

1. **Background/History** – Description of your organization and how the grant will help your community.

- 2. **Vendor Quote** Must be itemized, from one vendor, dated within 6 months, and include taxes/shipping.
- 3. **Financial Documents** Balance sheet, profit & loss statement, budget, or IRS Form 990 within the past month.
- 4. **Equipment Inventory** For first responder agencies. If you have none, you must state that
- 5. **IRS W-9 Form** Completed within the past year and signed.

Common Application Mistakes

- Missing or non-itemized quotes
- Financials that are outdated or don't show both revenue and expenses
- Using the same person for both the main and alternate contact
- Incomplete or unsigned W-9
- Financial or inventory documents missing your agency's name

Grant Application Responsibilities

Deputy Cornelius will be responsible for the grant application preparation, obtaining necessary quotes and program follow-up. These efforts will be reviewed by the Sheriff's Office administration and the county auditor's office to insure compliance.

How Grants Are Fulfilled

- Firehouse Subs Foundation may either:
 - o Purchase the equipment directly and send it to you, or
 - o Reimburse you via ACH after you sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and submit proof of purchase and delivery.

Summary

The Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation provides up to \$50,000 in funding per grant for life-saving equipment and education to qualified public safety agencies. Applications are accepted quarterly with clear documentation requirements, and awards are based on demonstrated need and community impact.

Who can apply for this grant?

Fire Departments, law enforcement, EMS, municipal & state organizations, public safety organizations, nonprofits and schools are encouraged to apply for lifesaving equipment.

If my organization has received a grant award from Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation in the past, when can we reapply?

We ask that grant recipients wait a minimum of two years from the date of approval before reapplying.

Does the Foundation provide reimbursements for purchased equipment?

No. If your organization has already purchased the equipment and is seeking reimbursement, please do not apply.

What are the most common reasons a grant application is marked incomplete?

- Quote is missing the required contact information and/or is not itemized
- Financials are outdated and/or do not include both revenues and expenses
- Alternate contact information is the same contact information as the main contact information
- The name of the organization is missing on the inventory and/or financials W9 form is missing the required information

Can my organization submit multiple grant applications?

The Foundation does not accept more than one grant request per organization each quarter. If your organization receives a grant, please wait a minimum of two years from the date of approval to apply again.

Is the Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation grant a matching grant? There are no matching funds involved in our organization's grants program.

If my request is more or less than \$20,000 will it be considered?

\$15,000-\$25,000 is a guideline. Requests exceeding \$50,000 will be denied.

If my department is located more than 60 miles from a Firehouse Subs restaurant, should I still apply?

Our Foundation focuses its resources in areas served by Firehouse Subs restaurants, however, we recognize the need of rural and volunteer departments throughout the country, and will consider applications outside of the 60-mile guideline.

When can we expect to find out if our grant has been approved or denied?

Grant award notifications will be emailed to ALL applicants within two months after the grant deadline. Please do not contact the Foundation, restaurants or the Firehouse Subs Care Center with questions regarding your grant status.

Does Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation fund requests for "use of force"?

Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation does not accept grant requests for "use of force" items such as guns, tasers, riot gear, or firearm simulators.

Does the Foundation only work with specific equipment vendors?

No, the Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation does not endorse any specific equipment vendor or brand. Our goal is to provide the equipment that best fits the needs of our recipients, at the best possible price, to enable us to help more organizations.

Does the Foundation fund requests for refurbished equipment? We do not accept grant requests for refurbished or pre-owned equipment.

Does the Foundation fund requests for patent-pending equipment? We do not accept grant requests for patent-pending products.

Does the Foundation accept requests for partial funding?

We will consider requests for partial funding, however, the balance of funds must be secured and outlined within your grant request. Documentation of partial funding must be included as part of your background/history attachment.



Safety Grant Program

Spirit of Blue's primary initiative is the granting of safety equipment and training to municipal, county and state law enforcement agencies in an effort to protect their sworn personnel.

Most grants are 100% funded, meaning that no match is required. In the majority of cases, Spirit of Blue conducts the procurement of the goods or services being granted so that the recipient agency isn't burdened with having to negotiate prices, place orders or track delivery. Rarely, if ever, does Spirit of Blue provide cash awards. Once selected, Spirit of Blue will provide the recipient agency with an official grant award letter outlining everything that is contained in the award. The recipient agency must gain acceptance of the grant, whether on the authority of their agency head or by working with their local governing authority as their policy may dictate. There are no reporting requirements after the award of the grant, but agencies are asked to submit a photo to be used in the announcement of their grant.

GRANT FAQ

Environmental listening

The environmental listening feature, also known as "talk-through" is a means of allowing safe audio sounds to bypass the individual hearing protection electronically while still helping protect against harmful noises. This is accomplished with 3M's proprietary digital audio circuit integrated into the headset.

L3Harris is one of two factory manufacturers of Gen3 image intensifier tubes in the United States. They provide the majority of goggle systems used by U.S. Special Operations Forces. These tubes are weapons rated for 5.56x45mm NATO. Please note that the entire TNV/PVS-14 system cannot be classified as MIL-SPEC because it is assembled by TNVC at our facility. Only fully factory-assembled L3 and Elbit Systems PVS-14s, built for a U.S. Military contract can be called MIL-SPEC. However, the TNV/PVS-14 provides the same performance.

The TNV/PVS-14 is available in several colors/finishes. Customers can choose standard black, Flat Dark Earth (FDE), or officially-licensed Crye MulticamTM. All of the housings start off as black. But, pure black sticks out like a sore thumb in the real world. This is why most Warfighters paint their black gear if given the opportunity. While hydro-dipping will create some minor imperfections, they do not affect the performance or durability of the finish.

Because TNV/PVS-14's are built to such a high standard, they require very little maintenance.
