Notice of Intent to Adopt Budget and Tax Rate

On September 8, 2025, at 9:00 AM in the Commissioners Courtroom, Johnson County Courthouse, 2 N. Main Street, Cleburne, Texas, the Commissioners Court will Conduct a Public Hearing on the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2025-2026. Immediately Following the Public Hearing, the Commissioners Court will Vote on the Proposed Budget.

On September 8, 2025, at 9:00 AM in the Commissioners Courtroom, Johnson County Courthouse, 2 N. Main Street, Cleburne, Texas, the Commissioners Court will Conduct a Public Hearing on the Proposed Tax Rate for the 2025 Tax Year. Immediately Following the Public Hearing, the Commissioners Court will Vote on the Tax Rate.

CALL TO ORDER

BE IT KNOWN that on the 11th day of August 2025, the Honorable Commissioners Court of Johnson County, Texas, met in Regular Session at the Johnson County Courthouse thereof, in the City of Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas, for the purpose of transacting any and all business that may lawfully be brought before the same.
