PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS

PA1. Update on the Status of the Johnson County Sheriff’s Office

Judge Boedeker stated that the Commissioners Court is not in a position to speak on what led to the turmoil within the Sheriff’s Department. He added that the media has covered the case as completely as possible, and it will play out in the District Court. He wanted to remind the public that there are 125 sworn Johnson County Officers who are committed to the mission of protecting and serving the public, and he doesn't want this to reflect poorly on them. He expressed his gratitude for their work.

Captain Ben Arriola echoed Judge Boedeker’s comments and stated that there are hundreds of dedicated law enforcement professionals, sworn and nonsworn, who have always put forth their full faith and effort to serve the citizens of this county, and they always will. He also wanted to thank the Court for what they have done over the last few years because that continues to attract qualified applicants.

Judge Boedeker thanked Captain Arriola for stepping into a very challenging situation, and specifically for his calm demeanor, temperament, and leadership.

Judge Boedeker stated that a new law went into effect on September 1st that calls for a Taxpayer Impact Statement.
