BE IT KNOWN that on the 26th day of May 2026, the Honorable Commissioners Court of Johnson County, Texas, met in Regular Session at the Johnson County Courthouse thereof, in the City of Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas, for the purpose of transacting any and all business that may lawfully be brought before the same. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M. with all members present. PA2. Update on Status of Major Transportation and Development Projects by Jennifer VanderLaan, Development Services Director

Development Services Director Jennifer VanderLaan presented and gave an update on two projects that have been proposed to the county. She added that the first project is an address request that said it was specifically for a data center, along with a permit application. Ms. VanderLaan stated that the permit application is still in the review process and that the County Engineer and Development Services are complying with all of the required timelines set forth by the state. She emphasized that no permit has been issued, but an application for a permit has been received. Ms. VanderLaan stated that for the second project, they received an address request that again said it would be for a data center, and they have also received a working site plan. She added that they have not received a development permit application, but they have received a site plan that does show buildings and services labeled for a data center. She reiterated that no permits have been issued.

Judge Boedeker stated that he had requested Development Services reach out to both applicants, asking them for power usage information, water usage information, and wastewater information, and to ask if the applicants are willing to host a public meeting to answer questions.

Ms. VanderLaan stated that she had extended an invitation to both representatives, asking if they would be available or interested in making a presentation to the Court. She added that she has not heard back from the first project, and that the second project responded, stating that since they have not asked for any activity or commenced any work on the ground, they do not think it's necessary at this time.

Further discussion was held.

County Engineer Colt Friedrich gave an update to the Court on the transportation bond program.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION - Members of the public who sign up prior to the beginning of the meeting will have 3 minutes to address the Court on any matter, whether or not the item is posted on the agenda. The Court is not permitted to respond or take action during this time. Speakers are subject to the Rules of Decorum posted on the County website and posted outside the Commissioners Courtroom.


