BE IT REMEMBERED THAT at a Regular meeting of the Commissioners' Court of Johnson County,
Texas, held on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of March A. D. 1944, the following members were present: Honorable Roy
Anderson, County Judge, Commissioner Wyatt, Precinct #1, Commissioner Hadley Precinct #2,
Commissioner Thompson Precinct #3, Commissioner Roland Precinct #4 and A. T. Griffin, County Clerk.
The following proceedings were had:

A motion was made by Commissioner Wyatt and seconded by Commissioner Roland that all properly approved accounts be allowed and paid. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Thompson and Roland voted "aye".

A motion was made by Commissioner Wyatt and seconded by Commissioner Thompson that the Tax Assessor-Collector be authorized to cancel the assessment placed on lot 2 in block 254 of the City of Cleburne for all years delinquent and to accept \$35.00 in full payment of all taxes against said property. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Thompson and Roland voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Wyatt and seconded by Commissioner Thompson that the Tax Assessor-Collector be authorized to cancel the valuation on lot 6 block 282 in Cleburne Texas, and to accept \$30.00 in full payment of all taxes against same. Commissioners Wyatt, Hadley, Thompson and Roland voted "Aye".

A motion was made by Commissioner Wyatt and seconded by Commissioner Roland that the Tax Assessor-Collector be authorized to cancel the assessment against lots 23 and 24 in Block 838 and lots 19 to 22 in block 838 for all years delinquent and to accept \$75.00 in payment of all taxes against same.
