BE IT REMEMBERED, that at a special meeting of the Commissioners Court of Johnson County, held in the Court House at Cleburne, Texas, the following members were present: Honorable H. G. Littlefair, County Judge, W. M. Coward, Commissioner Precinct 1, S. W. Evans, Commissioner Precinct 2, V. L. Maddox, Commissioner Precinct 3, M. W. Roland, Commissioner Precinct 4, and Louis B. Lee, County Clerk. Among other things they did the following:

A motion was made by Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner Roland that all proper and due bills be allowed and ordered paid as endorsed and submitted. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Maddox, seconded by Commissioner Evans that Lowell Smith, G. E. Bransom, and Clarence Mahanay be appointed members of the Board of Managers for the Johnson County Memorial Hospital for a two year term, effective November 1st, 1950. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Maddox, seconded by Commissioner Evans, that the bid of G. A. Coffey Company for 100 HP Motor Grader in the amount of \$11,443.00 with trade in allowance of one Austin Western Motor Grader in the amount of \$2,623.00, Net balance of \$8,820.00 be accepted as submitted for Precinct #1. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner Roland that the bid of J. M. Jett on Allis Chalmer front end loader, with trade in of one cle-track Loader, net balance \$5500.00 for Precinct 2, be rejected. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner Coward that the auditor be authorized to advertise for one front end loader, crawler type tractor, 40 or more HP, with a trade in of one crawler type 60 HP Cle-trax tractor with Drott front end loader, for Precinct #2. Bids to

be opened October 17, 1950 and the Commissioners Court reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Coward, seconded by Commissioner Evans, that the monthly financial report of the Johnson County Memorial Hospital for August, 1950, be approved as submitted. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Maddox, seconded by Commissioner Coward that the surplus funds in the Road Bond Interest & Sinking Funds in the amount of \$42,000.00 be appropriated to the R & B Precinct Funds for use on maintenance and improvements of the Johnson County Rural Roads. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Coward, seconded by Commissioner Evans that the Salaries for all the County employees and the County elected officials be increased 10% effective October 1, 1950. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland, seconded by Commissioner Coward that the bid of Hi-Way Machinery Company for one Austin Western Motor Grader in the amount of \$10,300. less trade in on Austin Western 99M in the amount of \$3,000.00, net difference \$7,300.00 be accepted for Precinct 4. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Coward, seconded by Commissioner Roland that R & B Precincts 1, 2, 3, and 4, refund to the S. O. Rosser Highway Account the amount of \$2,780.29. Said amount to be paid from each precinct equally in the amount of \$695.07. The refund represents over payment made by S. O. Rosser from Highway fund Collection, as found and approved by the County Auditor, George L. Murphy. All voted aye.
