A motion was made by Commissioner Coward, Seconded by Commissioner Evans, that all proper and duly endorsed bills be allowed and ordered paid as submitted. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner Roland that the Bond of Ben Field in the amount of \$1000.00 payable to the County Judge, as Justice of the Peace for Precinct #2, be approved. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner Coward that the public warehouseman's bond of the Farmers & Merchants Compress & Warehouse Company, located at Cleburne, Texas, in the amount of \$5000.00 payable to the State of Texas be accepted. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner Coward that Louis B. Lee, be appointed Registrar for Vital Statistics for Justice Precinct No. 1, which includes the City of Cleburne, effective July 1st, 1950 to December 31st, 1950. It is further ordered that the appointment of Dr. C. D. Hamilton as Registrar of Vital Statistics for Precinct No. 1 is hereby and now in all respects rescinded. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Coward, seconded by Commissioner Roland that the bid of Shaw Equipment Company, for Precinct 1, being the best and lowest bid, be accepted. All voted aye.

The bid is as follows:

- 1 - Allis Chalmers Model B. Tractor equipped with muffler, adjustable radiator shutter, foot brakes, electric starting and lighting; Model B Hi-Way Mower with hydraulic lift assembly, cutter bar with heavy duty guards; Ottawa Front End Loader

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland, seconded by Commissioner Maddox that the permanent school fund of Johnson County, Texas be authorized to purchase six bonds of the Grandview Independant School District, School house bonds series 1950 in the amount of \$6105. plus accrued interest; and that the road district No. 3 of Johnson County be authorized to purchase one bond of the Grandview Independant School District, School House Bonds Series 1950 in the amount of \$1000. plus accrued interest. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland, seconded by Commissioner Coward that the County Judge H. G. Littlefair, be authorized to sign a quit claim deed to the State Highway Department for that portion of the Right of Way on the west side of State Highway No. 174 from the north property line of the Porter Glass tract, to Kilpatrick Avenue which was formerly a part of the right of way of the County road and later designated by Commissioners Court of Johnson County as a State Highway. All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland, seconded by Commissioner Evans that the Hospital report for May, 1950 be approved as submitted. All voted aye.

A petition containing a large number of signatures of Citizens of the Lillian Community was presented to the court requesting a Farm to Market road from Lillian to Mansfield. The petition was reviewed and filed for further consideration.
