BE IT REMEMBERED at a Regular meeting of the Commissioners Court on the above mentioned date at the Courthouse in Cleburne, Texas, the following members were present: Ted W. Myatt, County Judge; W. M. Coward, Commissioner of Precinct No.1; Evelyn F. Evans, Commissioner of Precinct No.2; J. C. (Jim) Rayburne, Commissioner of Precinct No.3; M. W. Roland, Commissioner of Precinct No.4; Louis B. Lee, County Clerk, J. T. Epperson, Jr., County Auditor; John Moulder, C. K. Vermillion and Joe Townes.

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland and seconded by Commissioner Coward that all bills against Johnson County be allowed and ordered paid as presented, examined in open court and properly endorsed.

All voted aye

A motion was made by Commissioner Evans and seconded by Commissioner Coward that the resignation of E. L. Hewett as Justice of the Peace for Justice Precinct 2 effective Nov. 13, 1962 be accepted, and that Angus McMillan Crowder be appointed Justice of the Peace for Justice Precinct 2, Johnson County, Texas effective upon presenting suitable Bond for approval by the Court, for the unexpired term of the resigning Justice of the Peace.

A motion was made by Commissioner Coward and seconded by Commissioner Evans that the rate of pay for election Judges and workers in Johnson County is hereby set at \$10.00 per day for Election Judges and \$8.00 per day for workers respectively, and that said rate be effective in the General Election held on November 6, 1962.

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland and seconded by Commissioner Evans that tabulations of the General Election held Nov. 6, 1962 be approved as presented by the County Clerk and the results be recorded in the Election Record Book and be official in all respects.

All voted aye

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland and seconded by Commissioner Coward that the plat and dedication of the Tanglewood Addition, Johnson County be approved as presented to the Court by C. K. Vermillion. The dedication &

Restrictions be recorded in the Deed Records and plat in deed record when presented in proper form for permanent record to the County Clerk.
