BE IT REMEMBERED AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT IN AND FOR JOHNSON COUNTY, TEXAS, on the above-mentioned date at the courthouse in Cleburne, Texas, with the following members present: Hershel C. Winn, County Judge, W.M. Coward, Commissioner of Precinct No.1; W.R. Bryant, Commissioner of Precinct No.2; J.C. Rayburne, J.C. (Jim) Rayburne, Commissioner Precinct No. 3, M.W. Roland, Commissioner of Precinct No.4; Louie B. Lee, County Clerk, O. Odell Elliott, Assistant County Auditor, Lorene Moreland, County Auditor, and John Butner.

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland and seconded by Commissioner Coward that all bills against Johnson County be allowed and ordered paid as presented and examined in open court and properly endorsed.

All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland and seconded by Commissioner Coward that Commissioner's Court continue the present program on the Wolf Trapper for Johnson County whereby the County has agreed to supplement 50% of the cost of employing a trapper.

All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rayburne and seconded by Commissioner Bryant that the following motion and resolution of the Commissioner's Court Closing a portion of Area Designated as Streets in the Missouri and Pacific Addition to the City of Alvarado, Texas be accepted.

All voted aye.

MOTION AND RESOLUTION OF THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT CLOSING A PORTION OF AREA DESIGNATED AS STREETS IN THE MISSOURI AND PACIFIC ADDITION TO THE CITY OF ALVARADO, TEXAS.

WHEREAS, Don T. Balentine and Mrs. Billye Faye Balentine, husband and wife; E.L. Montgomery and Mrs. Nelda Montgomery, husband and wife; and R.N. Adams Construction Company; the owners of property contiguous to certain area designated as streets on the unrecorded plat of the Missouri and Pacific Addition to the City of Alvarado, Johnson County, Texas, have petitioned the Commissioner's Court of Johnson County, Texas, to close and abandon the following described portions of such designated streets:

The property abutting Sabine Street between Block 72 and 75, Trinity Street immediately south of Block 75, and Pecan Street immediately west of Block 72 and 75, all in the Missouri and Pacific Addition to the City of Alvarado, Johnson County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, said portions of said streets have never been laid out on the ground as such and have never been used as such; and

WHEREAS, said portions of said designated streets consist of unimproved land; and

WHEREAS, no underground sewer, water or public utilities have been installed on or under any portion of said designated streets; and

WHEREAS, there is no indication that said portions of said designated streets will ever be needed by the public as such; and

WHEREAS, said Missouri and Pacific Addition to the City of Alvarado, Texas, plat is not recorded in the records of Johnson County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, said Missouri and Pacific Addition is not within the city limits of Alvarado, Johnson County, Texas;

THEREFORE, on motion made by Commissioner Rayburne and duly seconded by Commissioner Bryant the following resolution was unanimously passed:

The property abutting Sabine Street between 72 and 75, and Trinity Street immediately South of Block 75, and Pecan Street immediately West of Block 72 and 75 of the Missouri and Pacific Addition to the City of Alvarado, Johnson County, Texas, be and the same is hereby closed and abandoned for all purposes.

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland and seconded by Commissioner Bryant that the monthly reports of March, April & May be approved as presented and examined in open court.

All voted aye.

A motion was made by Commissioner Roland and seconded by Commissioner Bryant that the County Auditor be authorized to pay the amount of all Hospital, Doctor bills and Drug bills incurred when Stewart Huffman was injured in line of duty with Paul Stout.

All voted aye.
