S. Highway 67 from the Ellis County Line to Cleburne, subject to the letter written by the County Judge of Johnson County, Texas, to Mr. R. W. Crook, District Engineer, Texas Highway Department, Fort Worth, dated September 8, 1969, in which the County stated, "The County, of course, would not have sufficient funds without a bond issue." This Resolution is passed subject to this provise.

LOCATION SURVEYS AND PREPARATION OF RIGHT OF WAY DATE: The State, without cost to the County, will do the necessary preliminary engineering and title investigation in order to supply to the County the data and instruments necessary to obtain acceptable title to the desired right of way.

DETERMINATION OF RIGHT OF WAY VALUES: The County agrees to make a determination of property values for each right of way parcel by methods acceptable to the County and to submit to the State's District Office a tabulation of the values so determinated, signed by the appropriate County representative. Such tabulations shall list the parcel numbers, ownership, acreage, and recommended compensation. Compensation shall be shown in the component parts of land taken, itemization of improvements taken, damages, if any (offset by enhancements, if any,) to the remainder, if any, and the amounts the total compensation will be reduced if the owner retains improvements. This tabulation shall be accompanied by an explanation to support the determined values, together with a copy of information or reports used in arriving at all determined values. Such work will be performed by the County at its expense without cost participation by the State. The State will review the data submitted and may base its reimbursement on the values as determined by this review. The State, however, reserves the right toperform at its own expense any additional investigation deemed necessary, including supplemental appraisal work by State employees or by employment of fee appraisers, all as may be necessary for determination of values to constitute the basis for State reimbursement.

NEGOTIATIONS: The State will notify the County as soon as possible as to the State's determination of value. Negotiation and settlement with the property owner will be the responsibility of the County without participation by the State; however, the County will notify the State immediately prior to closing the transaction so that a currant title investigation may be made to determine if there has been any change in the title. The County will deliver properly executed deeds which together with any curative instruments found to be necessary as a result of the State's title investigation will properly vest title in the State for each right of way parcel involved. The costs incidental

to negotiation and the costs of recording the right of way instruments will be the responsibility of the County. The cost of title investigation will be the responsibility of the State.

CONDEMNATION: Condemnation proceedings will be initiated at a time selected by the County and will be the County's responsibility at its own expense except as hereinafter indicated. The County will obtain from the State, without cost, current title information and engineering data at the time condemnation proceedings are to be initiated. Except as hereinafter set forth, the County will concurrently file condemnation proceedings and a notice of lis pendens for each case in the name of the State, and in each case so filed the judgment of the court will decree title to the property condemned in the name of the State. The County will accomplish the legal procedures and curative matters found to be necessary as a result of the State's title investigation, fulfilling the obligation to properly vest title in the State pf Texas. The County may, as set forth herein under "Excess Takings", enter condemnation proceedings in its own name.

COURT COSTS, COSTS OF SPECIAL COMMISSIONERS' HEARINGS AND APPRAISAL EXPENSE: Court costs and costs of Special Commissioners' hearings assessed against the State or County in condemnation proceedings conducted on behalf of the State, and fees incident thereto, will be paid by the County. Such costs and fees, with the exception of recording fees, will be eligibile for 50 per cent State reimbursement under the established reimbursement procedure provided such costs and fees are eligible for payment by the State under existing State law. Where the County uses the State's appraisers employed on a fee basis in Special Commissioners' hearings or subsequent appeals, the cost of the appraiser of updating his report, of preparing new reports, preparing for court testimony and appearing in court to testify in support of his appraisal will be paid direct by the County, but will be eligible for 50 per cent State reimbursement under established reimbursement procedure provided prior approval for such appraiser has been obtained from the State. The fee paid the appraiser by the County shall be in accordance with the fee schedule set forth in the appraiser's contract for appraisal services with the State.

EXCESS TAKINGS: In the event the County desires to acquire land in excess of that requested by the State for right of way purposes, the State's cost participation will be limited to the property needed for right of way purposes. If the County elects to acquire the entire property, including the excess taking, by a single instrument of conveyance or in one eminent domain proceeding, the property involved will be acquired in the name of the County and that portion requested by the State for right of way will be conveyed to the State. When acquired by negotiation, the State's participation will be based on the State's approved value of that part requested for right of way purposes, providing such approved value does not exceed actual payment made by the County. When acquired by condemnation, the State's participation will be in the proportionate part of the final judgment amount computed on the basis of the relationship of the State's approved value to the State's predetermined value for the whole property.

IMPROVEMENTS: Property owners will be afforded an opportunity in the negotiations to retain any or all of their improvements in the right of way taking. In anticipation of the owner desiring to retain his improvements, the State's approved value will include the amounts by which the upper limit of State participation will be reduced for the retention. It is further agreed that the upper limit for the State's participation in the County's cost for an improved parcel will be reduced as shown in the State's approved value where the owner retains an improvement which is to be moved by either the County or the owner. In the event the improvements which are, in whole or part, a part of the right of way taking are not retained by the owner, title is to be secured in the name of the State. The State will participate in the acquisition of a structure severed by the right of way line if the part of the house, building or similar structure outside the right of way cannot be reconstructed adequately or there is nothing but salvage left, provided the State's value is established on this basis

and provided title to the entire structure is taken inm the name of the State. The State shall dispose of all improvements acquired. The net revenue derived by the State from the disposition of any improvements sold through the Board of Control will be credited to the cost of the right of way procured and shared with the County.

RELOCATION OF UTILITIES: If the required right of way encroaches upon an existing utility located on its own right of way and the proposed highway construction requires the adjustment, removal or relocation of the utility facility, the State will establish the necessity for the utility work. State participation in the cost of making the necessary change, less any resulting increase in the value to the utility and less any salvage value obtainable, may be obtained by either the "actual cost" or "lump sum" procedures. Reimbursement under "actual cost" will be made subsequent to the County's certification that the work has been completed and will be made in an amount equal to 50 per cent of the eligibile items of cost as paid to the utility owner. The "lump sum" procedure requires that the State establish the eligibility of the utility work and enter into a three party agreement with the owners of the utility facilities and the County which sets forth the exact lump sum amount of reimburse ment based on a prior appraisal. The utility will be reimbursed by the County after proper certification by the utility that the work has been done, said reimbursement to be on the basis of the prior lump sum agreement. The State will reimburse the County in an amount equal to 50 per cent of the firm commitment as paid to the utility owner. The foregoing is subject to the provision that the individual lump sum approved value shall not exceed \$20,000, except as specifically approved by the State. In those casees where a single operation is estimated to exceed \$20,000, the transaction will be brought to the attention of the State for determination of proper handling based upon the circumstances involved. Such utility firm commitment will be an appropriate item of right of way. The adjustment, removal or relocation of any utility line on publicly owned right of way by sufferance or permit will not be eligible for State reimbursement. The term "utility" under this contract shall include publicly, privately, and cooperatively owned utilities.

FENCING REQUIREMENTS: The County may either pay the property owner for his existing right of way fences based on the value such fences contribute to the part taken and damages for an unfenced condition resulting from the right of way taking, in which case the estimated value of such right of way fences and such damages will be included in the recommended value and the approved value, or the County may do the fencing on the property owner's remaining property.

Where the County performs right of way fencing as a part of the total right of way consideration, neither the value of existing right of way fences nor damages for an unfenced condition will be included in the recommended value or the approved value. State participation in the County's cost of constructing right of way fencing on the property owner's remainder may be based either on the actual cost of the fencing or on a predetermined lump sum amount. The State will be given credit for any salvaged fencing material and will not participate in any overhead costs of the county.

If State participation is to be requested on the lump sum basis, the State and the County will reach an agreement prior to the actual accomplishment of work as to the necessity, eligibility, and a firm commitment as to the cost of the entire fencing work to be performed. The foregoing is subject to the provision that the lump sum approved cost shall not exceed \$20,000, except as specifically approved by the State. In case the fencing is estimated to exceed \$20,000, the transaction will be brought to the attention of the State for determination of proper handling based upon the circumstances involved.

REIMBURSEMENT: The State will reimburse the County for right of way acquired after the date of this contract in an amount not to exceed 50 per cent of the cost of the right of way acquired in accordance with the terms and provisions of this agreement. The State's reimbursement will be in the amount of 50 per cent of the State's predetermined value of each parcel, or the net cost thereof, whichever is the lesser amount.

If condemnation is necessary and title is taken as set forth herein under the section headed "Condemnation", the participation by the State shall be based on the final judgment, conditioned that the State has been notified in writing prior to the filing of such suit and prompt notice is also given as to all action taken therein. The State shall have the right to become a party to the suit at any time for all purposes, including the right of appeal at any stage of the proceedings. All other items of cost shall be borne by the State and the County as provided by other provisions of this agreement.

If a lump sum fencing or utility adjustment agreement has been executed, the State will reimburse the County in the amount of 50 per cent of the predetermined lump sum cost of the right of way fencing or utility adjustment.

If the County prefers not to execute a lump sum agreement for either fencing or utility adjustments, the State will reimburse on the actual cost of such adjustments. The County's request for reimbursement will be supported by a breakdown of the labor, materials and equipment used.

GENERAL: It is understood that the terms of this agreement shall apply to new right of way authorized and requested by the Texas Highway Department which is needed and not yet dedicated, in use, or previously acquired in the name of the State or County for highway, street, or road purposes. This agreement shall also apply, as to any existing right of way, to outstanding property interests not previously acquired and to eligible utility adjustments not previously made, as authorized and requested by the Texas Highway Department.

It is understood that this contract shall be effective from and after the date of full execution by the State of Texas.

It is further understood that if unusual circumstances develop in the right of way acquisition which are not clearly covered by the terms of this agreement, such unusual circumstances or problems will be resolved by mutual agreement between the State and the County.

 - 3. All medicine and doctor expenses shall be paid.
 - 4. Allowances shall be paid as follows:

\$.50 per week for ages 3 through 8\$.75 per week for ages 9 through 11\$1.25 per week for ages 12 and up

5. Foster parents shall be reimbursed for such incidentals as hair cuts, school lunches, school supplies, and special needs which case worker authorizes in advance.

The board also recommends that \$1,000.00 be set aside to be used for child care.

This was submitted prior to the regulations providing that the streets be paved; therefore, does not come under the new regulation about paved streets. Mr. Anderson pointed out there was an error on the plat he presented in that it denotes that it is "an addition to the City of Alvarado", which is incorrect. Commissioner Roland has not seen the roads since they have been

finished. Mr. Anderson asked the Court for tentative approval and a motion was made by Commissioner Roland, seconded by Commissioner Boteler to approve the plat of Woodbriar Addition, subject to Mr. Roland's inspection and subject to the Alvarado Lake Properties compliance with the letter from Childress and Recer dated May 23, 1969, relative to the percolation tests, as follows:

Gentlemen:

In accordance with your request, I have performed percolation tests on the above referenced property. Two separate tests were made. One test was made on Lot 3, Block One (Test No. 1), and the other test was made on Lot 25, Block One (Test No. 2).

Results are as follows:

Absorbtion Rate:

Test No. 1 -- 58 minutes per 1 inch Test No. 2 -- 20 minutes per 1 inch

You will note that the tests indicate a considerable difference in the absorbtion rate at the two locations. Test No. 1 was taken in an area where red clay soil is the predominant soil type. Test No. 2 was taken in an area generally made up of a sandy loam surface and gravelly sub-soil.

General Recommendations:

- 1. Areas similar in soil type to that covered by Test No. 1, indicates the need of 120 feet of 4-inch open joint drain tile laid in gravel for each 50 gallons per day usage, but not less than a total of 150 feet in any case.
- 2. Areas similar in soil type to that covered by Test No. 2, indicates the need of 75 feet of 4-inch open joint drain tile laid in gravel for each 50 gallons per day usage, but not less than a total of 150 feet in any case.
- 3. Usage should be calculated on a minimum of 50 gallons per day for each dagr (each member of family).
- 4. Septic tank systems should be designed and installed in accordance with with Texas State Department of Health recommendations.

Section 1: The County Judge of Johnson County and the Judge of the Judicial District which includes Johnson County shall constitute the Juvenile Board of that County. The Judge of the Court which is designated as the Juvenile Court of Johnson County shall be Chairman of the Board and its chief administrative officer.

Section 2: As compensation for the additional duties imposed upon them, the County and District Judge who are members of the Board shall each be allowed additional compensation of not less than \$1200.00 per year and not more than \$3600.00 per year, payable in twelve (12) equal monthly installments out of the general fund or and other available fund of Johnson County. Said compensation shall be set by the Commissioners Court Johnson County, Texas.

Section 3: This Act shall be cumulative of existing Laws relating to compensation of Judges of the District Courts and County Judges.

Section 4: The Juvenile Board of Johnson County shall appoint a Juvenile Officer for Johnson County, who shall meet all the qualifications and perform all the duties of a Juvenile Officer as prescribed by the Laws of this State. The Juvenile Officer shall be paid a salary as fixed by the Commissioners Court to be paid out of the General Fund or any other avilable fund of Johnson County. The Juvenile Board by majority vote shall have the power to discharge any appointee and such discharge need not be approved by the Commissioners Court.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to defining the jurisdiction of the County Court of Johnson County and the jurisdiction of the District Court of Johnson County; relating to prescribing the duties of the District Clerk and the County Attorney of Johnson County; amending Chapter 102, Acts of the 51st Legislature, Regular Session, 1949 (Article 1970-335, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes); and declaring an emergency.

BT IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. Chapter 102, Acts of the 51st Legislature, Regular Session, 1949 (Article 1907-335, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. The County Court of Johnson County shall have and exercise the general jurisdiction of a probate court, shall probate wills, appoint guardians of minors, idiots, lunatics, persons non compos mentis, and common drunkards; grant letters testamentary and of administration; settle the accounts of executors, administrators, and guardians transact all business pertaining to the estates of deceased persons, minors, idiots, lunatics, persons non compos mentis, and common drunkards, including the partition settlement, and distribution of estates of deceased persons pending in such Court; to conduct lunacy hearings; to apprentice minors as provided by law, and to issue all writs necessary for the enforcement of its own jurisdiction; to punish contempt under such provisions as now or may be provided for by General Law governing County Courts throughout the State; and in addition thereto, said County Court of Johnson County and the Judge thereof, subject to the conditions hereinafter stated, shall have jurisdiction over matters of eminent domain and other original civil jurisdiction, and original criminal jurisdiction and appellate civil jurisdiction and appellate criminal jurisdiction as are normally exercised by County Courts under the Constitution and General Laws of this State; provided, however, that all future Statutes pertaining to probate matters enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas shall be operative in Johnson County as fully as though this Statute had not been enacted.

"Section 2. The Judge of the District Court of Johnson County will be the presiding Judge, insofar as said District Court and said County Court are concerned, over original jurisdiction in matters of eminent domain, as well as original and appellate jurisdiction in all civil and criminal matters in causes over which by the laws of this State the County Court of Johnson County would have original or appellate jurisdiction; and all such causes will be filed with the District Clerk of Johnson County in said District Court. The Judge of the District Court of Johnson County may, in his discretion, assign to the County Court of Johnson County, for trial and disposition, cases, or portions thereof, of eminent domain as well as cases of original and appellate jurisdiction in civil and criminal matters and causes over which, by the General laws of this State, the County Court of Johnson County would have original or appellate jurisdiction. Such assignments shall be made by docket notation. The purpose and intent of this Statute is to vest the District Court of Johnson County and the County Court of Johnson County with concurrent jurisdiction over matters of eminent domain as well as original and appellate jurisdiction in all civil and criminal matters over which, by the General Laws of this State, the County Court of Johnson County would have original or appellate jurisdiction, subject to the control over assignments of such cases, or parts thereof, by the said District Court, as hereinabove set out.

"Section 3. The District Clerk of Johnson County shall continue to perform all the clerical functions of and for the County Court of Johnson County, insofar as all matters and causes over which the said District Court and County Court have concurrent jurisdiction, as hereinabove set out, said Clerk shall charge fees at the rate set by law for County Court cases.

"Section 4. The duties of the County Attorney of Johnson County shall not be in any manner changed or affected by this Act; and said County Attorney shall have and perform the same duties as were had and performed prior to the passage of this Act."

"Sec. 2. The crowded condition of the docket of the District Court of Johnson County establishes and creates ah imperative public necessity and emergency requiring the constitutional rule that bills be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and said rule is hereby suspended and this Act shall take effect from and after its passage, and it is so enacted."
