After July 1, 1972, the real property acquisition policies contained in said Act shall be followed in all cases.

The Service will bear 100 percent of the first \$25,000 of relocation payment costs for any person, business, or farm operation displaced prior to July 1, 1972. Any such costs for a single dislocation in excess of \$25,000 and all costs for relocation payments for persons displaced after July 1, 1972, will be shared by the Sponsoring Local Organization and the Service as follows:





RE: CRIMINAL INVESTIGATOR GRANT

NO. 2-E2-876

During the first eight months of operation of the office of Criminal Investigator, approximately two hundred misdemeanor cases and one hundred and fifteen felony cases have been investigated. The screening procedures now being used by this office have decreased the number of cases being filed in both County and District Courts. Thirty-eight cases have been absolved out of Court by this office because of such screening. This type of activity, of course, removes some of the load off both Courts, thus saving the County the expense of Court action. Also, the cases that are filed in these Courts are better, due to the proper evidence being obtained.

Approximately fifty guilty pleas were made in Court as a result of the extensive investigation efforts made to obtain the proper evidence which discourages innocent pleas.

The Criminal Investigator has appeared before the Grand Jury on forty-one cases. He has counseled eighty-four witnesses in preparation for appearances in court trials. Fifty-one signed confessions of guilt were obtained from suspects as a result of interrogation by this office; also approximately fifty oral confessions have been taken.

This office has been responsible for the location and arrest of more than sixty persons on old forgery and worthless check

cases that probably would have never been brought to trial due

to being unable to locate and serve warrants on defendants.

The Criminal Investigators office has set up and is maintaining records on known criminals and current cases. Also, this office has established liaison with law enforcement agencies of Fort Worth and Dallas intelligence and other municipal and county law enforcement departments, which enhances the effectiveness of this office.

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In the past thirty to sixty days the Criminal Investigators office has been responsible for the collection of \$8,000.00 in cash monies, for the County by locating defendants under capias pro fines in the District Clerk's office. This was accomplished at no added expense to Johnson County.

Also included in the operation of the Criminal Investigator's office have been the assignment of worthless check cases for investigation In the past thirty days investigation of these cases by this office has resulted in restitution of \$2,905.23 for the citizens of this county.

This office also has worked with and assisted law enforcement officers in Grandview, Joshua, Alvarado, Rio Vista, Burleson, Godley, Keene and Cleburne, and brought to conclusion several cases, both felony and misdemeanor. The undersigned has also fulfilled other assignments such as investigation of civil cases involving the interest of the Commissioners Court at no expense to the County.

In conclusion the undersigned requests that the present Criminal Justice Grant be extended for a five-year period. At present I believe the cost to the County of \$3,248.85 per year

is a very small cost for the benefits and service the County is receiving for the amount spent.

The undersigned proposes and requests the Honorable Commissioners Court to authorize the proper authorities in writing to pursue this matter immediately as a great demand is being made by other governmental agencies to the Criminal Justice Council for these grants; therefore, these funds could be depleted in the near future.





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
