Whereas, the Watershed Work Plan Agreement for the Chambers Creek Watershed, State of Texas, executed by the Sponsoring Local Organization named therein and the Service, became effective on the 9th day of December 1955; and

Whereas, the Supplemental Watershed Work Plan Agreement No. I for the Chambers Creek Watershed which added Johnson, Hill, Ellis, and Navarro Counties Commissioners Courts as Sponsoring Local Organizations and which set forth agreements with other sponsors on responsibilities of each, executed by the Sponsoring Local Organization named therein and the Service became effective on the 14th day of April 1959; and

Whereas, the Supplemental Watershed Work Plan Agreement Number II for said watershed, State of Texas, executed by the Sponsoring Local Organizations named therein and the Service became effective on the 25th day of October 1962; and

Whereas, in order to carry out the watershed work plan for said watershed, it has become necessary to modify said Watershed Work Plan Agreement; and

Whereas, the creation of the Hill County-Blackland and the Johnson County Soil and Water Conservation Districts has changed the names and boundaries of sponsoring soil and water conservation districts. The Navarro-Hill Soil Conservation District has been changed to the Navarro Soil and Water Conservation District with a change in boundary. The Nolan-Aquilla District has been disbanded and its boundaries and responsibilities have been assumed by other soil and water conservation districts within the boundaries of the watershed; and

Whereas, it has become necessary to modify the Watershed Work Plan as supplemented to comply with the provisions of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (Public Law 91-646, 84th Stat. 1894); and

Whereas, it has been found necessary to modify the Watershed Work Plan as supplemented to reflect current terminology relative to engineering and project administration costs; and

Whereas, a Supplemental Watershed Work Plan No. III which modified the Watershed Work Plan dated July 1955 for said watershed has been developed through the cooperative efforts of the Sponsoring Local Organization and the Service; which plan is annexed to and made a part of this agreement; and

Now, therefore, the Sponsoring Local Organization and the Service hereby agree upon the following modifications of the terms, conditions, and stipulations of said Watershed Work Plan Agreement:

1. The Sponsoring Local Organization will provide relocation advisory assistance services and make the relocation payments to displaced persons as required by the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (Public Law 91-646, 84th Stat. 1894) effective as of January 2, 1971, and the Regulations issued by the Secretary of Agriculture pursuant thereto. Prior to July 1, 1972, the Sponsoring Local Organization will comply with the real property acquisition policies contained in said Act and Regulations to the extent that they are legally able to do so in accordance with their State law. After July 1, 1972, the real property acquisition policies contained in said Act shall be followed in all cases.

The Service will bear 100 percent of the first \$25,000 of relocation payment costs for any person, business, or farm operation displaced prior to July 1, 1972. Any such costs for a single dislocation in excess of \$25,000 and all costs for relocation payments for persons displaced after July 1, 1972, will be shared by the Sponsoring Local Organization and the Service as follows:

3. The Sponsoring Local Organization and the Service will each bear the costs of Project Administration which it incurs, estimated to be \$61,610 and \$1,770,440, respectively.
4. The Sponsoring Local Organization and the Service further agree to all other terms, conditions, and stipulations of said Watershed Work Plan Agreement not modified herein.
5. The program conducted will be in compliance with all requirements respecting nondiscrimination as contained in the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture (7 C.F. R. 15.1-15.12), which provide that no person in the United States shall on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any activity receiving Federal financial assistance.

During the first eight months of operation of the office of Criminal Investigator, approximately two hundred misdemeanor cases and one hundred and fifteen felony cases have been investigated. The screening procedures now being used by this office have decreased the number of cases being filed in both County and District Courts. Thirty-eight cases have been absolved out of Court by this office because of such screening. This type of activity, of course, removes some of the load off both Courts, thus saving the County the expense of Court action. Also, the cases that are filed in these Courts are better, due to the proper evidence being obtained.

Approximately fifty guilty pleas were made in Court as a result of the extensive investigation efforts made to obtain the proper evidence which discourages innocent pleas.

The Criminal Investigator has appeared before the Grand Jury on forty-one cases. He has counseled eighty-four witnesses in preparation for appearances in court trials. Fifty-one signed confessions of guilt were obtained from suspects as a result of interrogation by this office; also approximately fifty oral confessions have been taken.

This office has been responsible for the location and arrest of more than sixty persons on old forgery and worthless check cases that probably would have never been brought to trial due to being unable to locate and serve warrants on defendants.

The Criminal Investigators office has set up and is maintaining records on known criminals and current cases. Also, this



office has established liaison with law enforcement agencies of Fort Worth and Dallas intelligence and other municipal and county law enforcement departments, which enhances the effectiveness of this office.

In the past thirty to sixty days the Criminal Investigators office has been responsible for the collection of \$8,000.00 in cash monies, for the County by locating defendants under capias pro fines in the District Clerk's office. This was accomplished at no added expense to Johnson County.

Also included in the operation of the Criminal Investigator's office have been the assignment of worthless check cases for investigation. In the past thirty days investigation of these cases by this office has resulted in restitution of \$2,905.23 for the citizens of this county.

This office also has worked with and assisted law enforcement officers in Grandview, Joshua, Alvarado, Rio Vista, Burleson, Godley, Keene and Cleburne, and brought to conclusion several cases, both felony and misdemeanor. The undersigned has also fulfilled other assignments such as investigation of civil cases involving the interest of the Commissioners Court at no expense to the County.

In conclusion the undersigned requests that the present Criminal Justice Grant be extended for a five-year period. At present I believe the cost to the County of \$3,248.85 per year is a very small cost for the benefits and service the County is receiving for the amount spent.

The undersigned proposes and requests the Honorable Commissioners Court to authorize the proper authorities in writing to pursue this matter immediately as a great demand is being made by other governmental agencies to the Criminal Justice Council for these grants; therefore, these funds could be deple-

ted in the near future.

It is with great respect and gratitude that this request is being made to the Honorable Commissioners Court of this County.
