BE IT REMEMBERED AT A SPECIAL CALLED MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT IN AND FOR JOHNSON COUNTY, TEXAS, on the above-mentioned date at the Courthouse in Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas, with the following members present: C.W. Atwood, Commissioner of Precinct No.1, A.J. Lambert, Commissioner of Precinct No.2, Loyd H. Reese, Commissioner of Precinct No.3, and B.B. Aldridge, Commissioner of Precinct No.4 and Judge Altaras, County Judge and Joe L. Townes, County Clerk.

Purpose of Special Called Meeting is to consider odd-even gasoline rationing.

Judge Altaras asked each commissioner to state the results of their findings in each precinct.

C.W. Atwood, Commissioner Precinct No.1

- 1. Feels that rationing would eliminate long lines, keep service stations open longer hours and eliminate out-of-county cars coming into Johnson County to fill up.

A.J. Lambert, Commissioner of Precinct No.2

- 2. The odd and even rationing plan is distributing people in the area more so in the northern part of the County and about 50/50 in other areas of the County, and feel that odd and even rationing may give us an additional allocation.

Loyd Reese, Commissioner of Precinct No.3.

- 3. Many people in the Alvarado area communicate back and forth to work and feel that it creates a hardship on those people.

B.B. Aldridge, Commissioner of Precinct No.4

- 4. This is a very serious problem in all parts of the county. The Grandview Area is having problems with traffic coming off of I-35 and creating a more serious shortage for residents of the Grandview area.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lambert and seconded by Commissioner Atwood to request the Governor to place Johnson County on the odd-even gasoline rationing plan and that Johnson County be included in the Metroplex gasoline allocation plan to increase our supply by 5%.
