A motion was made by Commissioner Aldridge and seconded by Commissioner Reese to rescind previous resolution by Johnson County Commissioners' Court and withdrawn from the Equal Evaluation, Tax Plan, known as S.B. 621.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lambert and seconded by Commissioner Atwood to appoint Joe Townes to act as Liaision representative for the Local Review Program and the Federal Bureau of the Census for the 1980 census.
