BE IT REMEMBERED AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT IN AND FOR JOHNSON COUNTY, TEXAS, on the above-mentioned date at the Courthouse in Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas, with the following members present: C.W. Atwood, Commissioner of Precinct No.1; Loyd H. Reese, Commissioner of Precinct No.3; B.B. Aldridge, Commissioner of Precinct No.4; Tommy Altaras, County Judge and Joe L. Towens, County Clerk.

A motion was made by Commissioner Aldridge and seconded by Commissioner Atwood to approve the following retirement plan effective January 1, 1981.

A request from the Johnson County Memorial Hospital regarding emergency water supply in case of a disaster was passed by the court for further study.

A confirmation from Mr. Ted Sivadon, Masonry Specialist Company, that his company will repair the loose marble slab on the north end of the main floor of the Courthouse within the next few weeks.

A motion was made by Commissioner Atwood and seconded by Commissioner Reese to pay the actual cost of relocation and/or adjustment of utility lines on FM 3136 as outlined in the following letter from State Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

The Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C., notified the court that the preliminary populations count for Johnson County is 67, 306 and the preliminary housing county is 24,808.
