6. JOHNSON COUNTY RURAL FIRE COMMISSION

1. JOHNSON COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Danny Butler, Construction Manager, and Frank Neal, Engineer, gave a progress report on the Law Enforcement Center.

2. AWARD OF BIDS: CONSTRUCTION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Motion was made by Comm. Harmon, seconded by Comm. Miller, to approve the low bid of Virgil Rhodes in the amount of \$79,710.00 for the construction of the drainage structures for the Law Enforcement Center. (The bid submitted was \$83,710.00, and a deduction of \$4,000.00 was taken when the Court decided not to sprig coastal bermuda due to the completion date being too late to plant costal bermuda.
