BE IT KNOWN that on this the 17th day of April, 1989, the Honorable Commissioners' Court of Johnson County, Texas, met in regular session with all members present, in the Courthouse in the City of Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas, and following the invocation and the pledge of allegiance, the following items were considered:

JOHNSON COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Discussion was held regarding the telephone system at the Johnson County Law Enforcement Center with a representative from Southwestern Bell Telecom. Problems were addressed, with no action being taken.

VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL

A motion was made by Comm. Miller, seconded by Comm. Hewlett, to approve a Vietnam Memorial statue being placed on the east side of the Courthouse that will be created by Doug Prine of Alvarado.

All voted aye; motion passed.

JOHNSON COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Motion was made by Comm. Harmon, seconded by Comm. Estes, to set a second tier of charges for holding prisoners at the Johnson County Law Enforcement Center at \$45.00 per day for each prisoner for a guaranteed number of prisoners for a 30-day period.

All voted aye; motion passed.

A motion was made by Comm. Estes, seconded by Comm. Hewlett, to approve the number of 10 modular two-drawer filing cabinets for the Law Enforcement Center at an estimated cost of \$1,200.00 from Mr. D's and to approve Sherwin Williams installing floor covering in the medical section of the Law Enforcement Center at a cost of \$782.43.

All voted aye; motion passed.

ADVERTISING FOR BIDS

A motion was made by Comm. Harmon, seconded by Comm. Miller, to approve advertising for bids for two (2) violent cells at the Law Enforcement Center.

All voted aye; motion passed.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE OF AGRICULTURE EXTENSION OFFICE

A report was given by Ona Ballard. No action was taken.
