BE IT KNOWN that on the 13th day of December, 1999, the Honorable Commissioner's Court of Johnson County, Texas, met in regular session at 9:00 A.M., with all members present in the Courthouse, in the City of Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas, and following the Invocation led by Donnie Williams, and the Pledge of Allegiance, the following items were considered:

VI. PRECEDING BUSINESS

1. OATH OF OFFICE FOR COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER –
ARTHUR L. RAINES, M.D.

Dr. Arthur Raines was given the Oath of Office as County Health Officer for a two year term.

2. PRESENTATION OF CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT
FOR EXCELLENCE IN FINANCIAL REPORTING

A Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting was awarded to Johnson County by Government Finance Officers Association. The award is the highest form of recognition in governmental accounting. County Auditor Donnie Williams was present an Award of Financial Reporting Achievement.
