I. ACTION TO APPROVE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE STATE OF TEXAS AND JOHNSON COUNTY FOR CHILD SUPPORT CASES

Comm. Carpenter, seconded by Comm. Thompson, made a motion to approve the cooperative agreement between the office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas and Johnson County for child support cases.

II. ACTION TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS/PROPOSALS:

1. 4-DOOR CREW CAB FOR INMATE TRUCK-PRECINCT #4
2. PHARMACY SERVICES FOR INDIGENT HEALTH

Comm. Thompson, seconded by Comm. Harmon, made a motion to approve advertising for bids/proposals for (1) 4-door crew cab for inmate truck for Precinct #4 and (2) for pharmacy services for Indigent Health.
