The meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M., with all members present, and following the Invocation led by Pete Hobby, and the Pledge of Allegiance, the following items, having been lawfully posted and filed for record in the Office of the County Clerk on March 21, 2013 at 9:45 A.M., were considered:
