COMMISSIONERS COURT GRANTING AN EXEMPTION UNDER SECTION 262.024, LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, FROM THE BIDDING REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 262.023, LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, UPON THE COMMISSIONERS COURT FINDING THAT THE PURCHASE OF ALCOHOL MONITORING SYSTEM TECHNOLOGY FROM SCRAM SYSTEMS IS AN ITEM THAT CAN BE OBTAINED FROM ONLY ONE SOURCE

The Johnson County Commissioners Court met on September 26, 2016 in regular session for the consideration that the purchase of alcohol monitoring system technology from SCRAM Systems is an item that can be obtained from only one source because of the existence of patents, copyrights, secret processes or monopolies. The Commissioners Court finds that this item can be obtained from only one source in that the SCRAMS System is the only evidential instrument on the market that utilizes science of transdermal testing to measure alcohol consumption and that the Commissioners Court may grant an exemption under Section 262.024, Local Government Code, from the competitive bidding requirements of Section 262.023, Local Government Code.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rick Bailey and seconded by Commissioner Kenny Howell that: "The Commissioners Court finds that the purchase of alcohol monitoring system technology from SCRAM Systems is an item that can be obtained from only one source because of the existence of patents, copyrights, secret processes or monopolies, and that the Commissioners Court grant an exemption under Section 262.024, Local Government Code, from the competitive bidding requirements of Section 262.023, Local Government Code, and enter an order to that affect, and that the Commissioners Court approve the purchase as an item that can be obtained from only one source because of the existence of patents, copyrights, secret processes or monopolies.

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Said motion was approved by a vote of the Commissioners Court on the 26th day of September, 2016.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED:

The Commissioners Court of Johnson County, Texas does hereby enter this order granting an exemption under Section 262.024, Local Government Code, from the bidding requirements of Section 262.023, Local Government Code, upon the Commissioners Court finding that the purchase of alcohol monitoring system technology from SCRAM Systems is an item that can be obtained from only one source because of the existence of patents, copyrights, secret processes or monopolies.
