BE IT KNOWN that on the 8th day of May, 2017, the Honorable Commissioners Court of Johnson County, Texas, met in Regular Session at the Johnson County Courthouse thereof, in the City of Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas, for the purpose of transacting any and all business that may lawfully be brought before the same. The meeting was called to order at 9:02 A.M., with all members present, and following the Invocation led by Commissioner Larry Woolley, Precinct #4, and the Pledge of Allegiance, the following items, having been lawfully posted and filed for record in the Office of the County Clerk on May 4, 2017 at 1:07 P.M., were considered:

IV. WELCOME VISITORS, ANNOUNCEMENTS & PRESENTATIONS

County Judge Roger Harmon passed out baseball style caps from the Texas Association of Counties to members of Commissioners Court to show the unity of Texas counties regarding unfunded mandates. Judge Harmon said he was against the State passing the costs of certain programs to the Counties in the form of unfunded mandates.
