#### VI. PUBLIC HEARING

The Commissioners Court opened a Public Hearing at 9:27 A.M. to discuss:

#### 1. 2<sup>ND</sup> PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED JOHNSON COUNTY TAX RATE FOR THE 2018 TAX YEAR

County Judge, Roger Harmon read into Court record the Proposed Tax Rates for the 2018 Tax Year. They are as follows: General Fund/M&O Tax Rate, \$0.407647, Debt Tax Rate, \$0.034053, Road & Bridge Tax Rate, \$0.030300; which is a combined Proposed Tax Rate of \$0.472000.

Janell Lee, a resident of Burleson, TX, addressed the Court in regards to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Public Hearing on the Proposed Johnson County Tax Rate for the 2018 Tax Year. Lee requested clarification for a \$25,000.00 line item for Vending Machine Commissions. Secondly, she addressed the Courts proposal, which was approved in a previous court session, to issue pre-paid debit cards instead of continuing the practice of issuing checks to inmates with a commissary balance upon their release from jail.

Johnson County Auditor, Kirk Kirkpatrick addressed the Court to clarify that the line item questioned by Lee is a revenue line item, not an expenditure line item and is only \$2,000.00 not \$25,000.00 as stated by Lee.

Mike Millsap addressed the Court in regards to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Public Hearing on the Proposed Johnson County Tax Rate for the 2018 Tax Year. Millsap addressed property taxes.

County Judge, Roger Harmon addressed the Court to clarify the County's Proposed Tax Rate is not increasing; it will remain the same as last year. He continued to discuss how the current legislation is affecting taxes, specifically school and property taxes.

Comm. Bailey addressed the Court to discuss the legislation and its effects on school taxes and property taxes. He also addressed the County's growth and its potential to lower tax rates due to increased revenue.

Kevin Boron, a resident of Joshua, TX, and business owner in Johnson County, addressed the Court in regards to the 2nd Public Hearing on the Proposed Johnson County Tax Rate for the 2018 Tax Year. Boron discussed a possible procedural issue he experienced between the City of Joshua and the Central Appraisal District.

County Judge, Roger Harmon addressed the Court to clarify that the Court does not set the procedures for the Central Appraisal District or the Cities within Johnson County.

Comm. Bailey, Comm. Howell and Comm. Stringer addressed the Court and commented on possible ways to streamline the permitting procedures.

Comm. Woolley addressed the Court and commented on the potential effects on taxes due to the loss of sales tax revenue because of e-trade. There being no else to speak, the hearing was closed at 10:00 AM
